

# LONESOME CLUB TEAMS UP FRIENDLINESS; MAKES BIG HIT

NEW YORK, Oct. 12.—A little widow sat all alone on a park bench and watched the young people strolling by.

Over by the curb a handsome limousine had drawn up. Inside the automobile a smartly dressed young woman regarded the little widow wistfully. After a while she leaned out and spoke.

"You look lonesome," she said, "and I'm lonesome, too. Won't you come and ride with me?"

"This was one of the adventures in lonesomeness recounted at a meeting of the Lonesome Club organized by Miss Clara Salem, an attorney. The gatherings are held in a church here.

"Writers and preachers," says Miss Salem, "are always extolling motherhood. But if an unmarried woman speaks right up in meeting and says she'd like to be a wife and mother if she only had the chance she's looked down upon as being downright immodest.

"God created both men and women and he meant they should associate with one another. For the men and women whom circumstances have denied the ordinary avenues of association I have organized my Lonesome Club. I expect it to sweep all over the United States."

Men have taken to Miss Salem's idea more quickly than women.

"At the first meeting," says the founder, "there were 25 men and two women. At the next gathering the number was increased to 39 men and 19 women. Among them were young doctors, lawyers, school teachers and stenographers.

"Four couples paired off, went to a neighboring restaurant for dinner and then out for a bus ride. The club was already fulfilling its purpose."
