



Another Old Mining Town Becomes "Ghost"

STOCKTON, Calif., Oct. 25.—Once the fourth city in size in California, Columbia, an old mining town on the mother lode south of here, has joined the list of "ghost cities" inhabited mainly by memories.

Back in the gold days Columbia was called the "gem of the southern mines" and at one time it was thought of as a possible location for the capitol of the state.

From the placers around Columbia between \$55,000,000 and \$60,000,000 were taken out in free gold in the early days. Several weeks ago a stranger tried to buy placer gold at Columbia and was told not a bit could be had.

One of the few remaining residents of Columbia is Thomas Conlin, for years the telegraph and express agent. Conlin still holds forth on the town's main street, custodian of the memories of the days when the town's population numbered 15,000.

Settler Dead at 90

COLTON, Calif., Oct. 25.—Don Pedro Belarde, for eighty years resident of Colton, died here recently at the age of 90 years. Belarde first entered the San Bernardino valley with settlers from New Mexico in 1842. At one time he was very wealthy, but his estates, consisting mostly of lands and cattle, have since disappeared.
