

NEW INDUSTRY IS BELIEVED COMING TO GRANTS PASS

EUGENE, Ore., Oct. 26.—Extensive development of limestone quarries and the erection of a large cement factory at Grants Pass, Ore., near here, are indicated. It is believed locally by the fact that the Heaver Portland Cement company has advertised for bids for the construction of a standard gauge railway three miles long and 4,000 feet of roadway leading from the California and Oregon Coast railway to the company's quarries in the mountains southwest of Grants Pass.

Backers of the project have announced that a cement plant will be erected somewhere in the vicinity and have indicated that Grants Pass, by a point near there, would be the logical location for such a plant. The cost of the enterprise is estimated at \$1,500,000.

The new railroad is to be known as the Marble Mountain railroad. The survey for it has been completed, and a right of way purchased. According to representatives of the company, the railroad and tramway will be completed early in 1923.

An electric power plant, construction of which has already been started, is included in the plans of the company.

The new railroad will open up an almost unlimited supply of 98 percent pure calcium carbonate. The lime area is known to be over 25 acres in extent. It is estimated that 50,000,000 tons are in this area. The deposit is exposed vertically to a depth of 750 feet.

New Dormitories to be Built at U. of California

BERKELEY, Cal., Oct. 27.—Work on the first of a series of dormitory units for women, to represent in the aggregate an expenditure of \$300,000, will be started at the University of California here next May, according to plans announced by the students committees on dormitories. The board of regents has already approved the program and a campaign for building funds will be launched at the opening of the next semester.

Each unit in the proposed building scheme will be divided into halls containing from 25 to 35 rooms and is intended to take care of about 60 students.
