WASHINGTON, Oct. 31.—Great increase in the amount of work done by the American Red Cross in the field of public health, through its nursing services, public hygiene and care of the sick, through its convalescent homes, first aid and life saving classes, health centers and other programs, is disclosed in the annual report of the organization for the past fiscal year, which has just been made public.

The increasing establishment of services that broaden among the people approved health conservation and disease prevention information emphasizes the necessity of continuing support through a world-wide response to the annual roll call of the society from November 11 to 20, the report states.

The war time nursing service of the American Red Cross, which 19,527 nurses were furnished for active duty, has not been allowed to overshadow the society's peace time nursing service.
