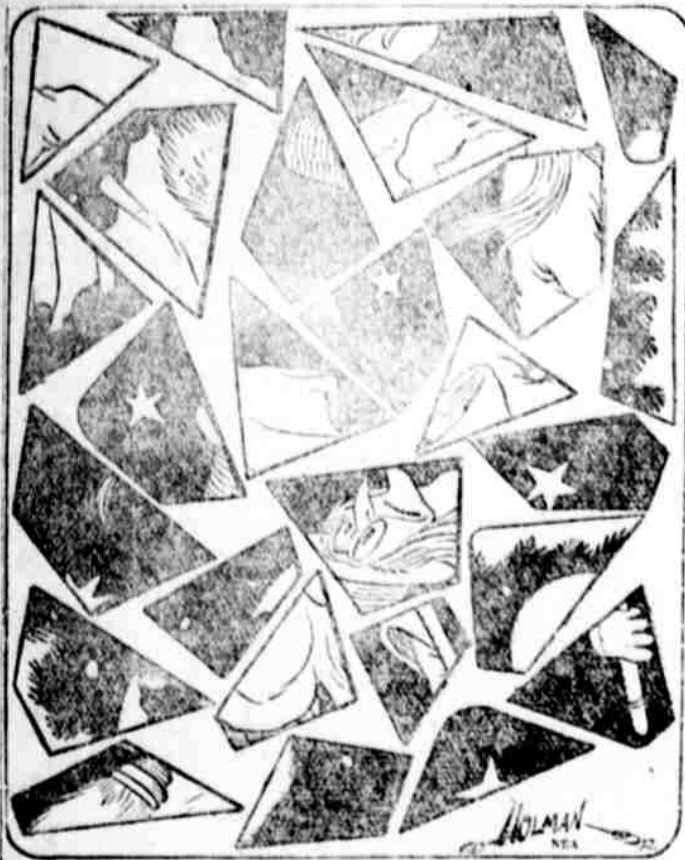


### A HALLOWE'EN PUZZLE

### 3 GERMAN BOXERS HOLD THEIR TITLES IN RECENT BOUTS

BERLIN, Oct. 31.—Three German boxing champions successfully defended their titles all on the same bill here recently. Ulyan Grass, the bantam-weight titleholder, was in severe grounds because his opponent's skull was so badly damaged in a head-on collision that his seconds threw in the towel. The loser was "Phenomenon" Volkmer, who is more than 70 years of age.

Hans Brotenstraeter, Germany's heavy-weight pride, knocked out the Belgian heavy-weight champion, Jef de Pau, in six rounds. Richard Masloek, the German lightweight titleholder, defeated the Belgian boxer Class on points; but the decision was not generally approved. Hanna, Austria's water-weight champion, gave up in the sixth

round to Ernst Grimm, a Berlin fighter. The bill attracted one of the largest gates ever attending a German boxing program, the spectators numbering more than 10,000. Considerable interest was manifested here in Siki's sensational defeat of Carpenter, boxing fans recalling that Brotenstraeter once battled the Sengalese to a draw.

### High Rents Still With Washington

WASHINGTON, D. C., Oct. 31.—For many months, even before the late war, Washingtonians were told the reason for the skyrocketing rents for houses and apartments was the shortage of housing facilities. Where demand exceeds the supply, realtors said, the price of the supply will mount. Washington rents are still high.

### BENNETT HILL WINS AT COTATI

100-Mile peedway Classic Driven at Average peed of 114.5 M. Per Hour

COTATI, Cal., Oct. 31.—Bennett Hill won the 100-mile automobile classic at the Cotati speedway Sunday, covering the distance in 52 minutes and 38 seconds, an average speed of 114.5 miles an hour.

Frank Elliott, winner of the last race at Cotati, was second, and Jimmy Murphy took third place. Harry Hariz was fourth.

When Hill finished the right front tire on his car was throwing rubber 30 feet into the air, but he refused to take to the pit to change the tire during the closing laps of the race, because it would have cost him first place, as Elliott was only a lap behind.

Tommy Milton was put out of the race in the first lap, when a splinter flew from the track, hitting his goggles and breaking the glass. The particles lodged in one of Milton's eyes, blinding him, as he has but one serviceable eye. He was taken from the speedway to a Petaluma hospital.

But "there were 3,483 vacant houses, apartment and flats in Washington this year," according to a recent survey of engineers of the local telephone company. "Of this total, 2,279 were houses, 708 were apartments and 496 were classified as flats."

The survey was made to estimate the amount of the company's business in the coming years. It resulted in the declaration by the engineers that since 1917 a decreasing number of families are living in houses, as well as a decreasing number residing in apartments. Because of high prices, evidently, the survey showed that more persons have had to resort to "flats" rooming houses and light housekeeping establishments.

### English Girls Turn To Simpler Weddings

LONDON, Oct. 31.—Old-fashioned weddings at church with lavish decorations, gaily bedecked brides and bridesmaids, bell ringing and elaborate ceremonies, are gradually giving way to more sombre and simpler weddings at registry offices. Statistics show that 25 per cent of the total marriages in this country during the year have been performed at registry offices. In London alone of 50,000 marriages, 16,000 were conducted by the registrar, and throughout the country the number of civil ceremonies has grown from 30,000 in 1890, to three times that number.

Among many reasons given for favoring the civil marriage is the desire to avoid publicity by contracting parties, particularly in the case of dukes, peers, theatrical

stars and other prominent persons when remarrying.

English brides of the past generation would have been aghast at the thought of marrying without the proverbial orange blossom wreath and the retinue of bridesmaids, but broadening ideas developed by the present day girl make her prefer the simple ceremony without the "fussiness" of the big church service and the army of spectators.
