First Man Operated on Under Influence of "Nerve Block," the New Anesthesia, Which Deadens Only Local Parts of the Body.

CHICAGO, Nov. 2.—I had been discharged from the navy as a hopeless invalid because of an abscess on the left lung.

On three previous occasions had undergone operations with ether,

none of which could be completed, because of the ether's effects.

Then Dr. Nelson H. Lowry took me under his care and soon after I was placed on an operating table at the Illinois Masonic hospital in Chicago.

Nerve block anesthesia was administered to me and soon my entire left side around the region of the lung seemed to have gone to sleep.

Seven Ribs Removed

My mind was clear though, and I laughed and joked with the nurses while I watched the doctor remove seven of my ribs while I lay in a sort of half sitting position.

Then with his knife the doctor worked into my heart, so it seemed, opening all the walls around the abscess.

It was fun to watch my heart throb; it even reached over and touched it.

Throughout all the operation I felt no pain.

In fact it was amusing to watch my internal organs function.

No one can ever tell me that I have an heart. I know I have.

Gains 10 Pounds

I have gained 10 pounds since my heart was an open secret even to myself.

Nerve block, the doctor told me, is like a local shutdown on a great electrical circuit.

Years ago when there was a break in the line, engineers had to close the whole power plant.

Now they merely plug out the affected part and the rest of the mechanism continues to function.

So surgeons have perfected a method of shutting off the nerve supply for an affected part of the body.

In this blocked area there is no sensation, and any repair can be made without pain or discomfort, while the rest of the body is functioning as usual.
