

EVAN TAYLOR EXPRIES

Boy Shot by Hunting Companion Saturday Falls to Recover

Evan Taylor, 17, who was shot by his hunting companion, Alvin Smith, near Malin Saturday morning died in a local hospital Sunday morning after surgical measure had proved unavailing.

Taylor, who was employed on the ranch of his brother, A. H. Taylor, had gone to the Strader ranch for a load of straw, which were armed with shotguns, and, coming upon a couy of quail, both fired. According to accounts, Smith's gun was accidentally discharged before he had brought it up to his shoulder, the charge entering Taylor's side and abdomen.

Taylor is survived by his mother, Mrs. Lena Ownsbey, a brother, A. H. Taylor, and another brother who resides in Washington. An inquest was being held by Coroner Whitlock this afternoon.
