## LUMBER CARGOES BREAK RECORDS

### Increase of 91 Per Cent Is Shown in Shipments From Mills of Northwest

PORTLAND, Nov. 8.—Breaking all previous records for the delivery of Pacific Northwest lumber by water, the mills of Washington, Oregon and British Columbia shipped cargoes totaling 2,381,293,785 feet during the first nine months of 1922 as compared with 1,249,657,319 feet for the like period in 1921. The increase is 91 per cent.

Lumber, delivered by water, to California markets from January 1st to October 1st this year amounted to 1,168,555,250 feet, which was an increase of 84 per cent over the California water deliveries for the first nine months of 1921.

Exclusive of California cargoes, deliveries to other United States domestic markets increased 117 per cent. The movement, through Panama canal, to North Atlantic coast markets increased 182 per cent over the first nine months of last year.

In the export trade Japanese buyers increased 122 per cent the first nine months of this year compared with the same period in 1921. Australia increased its purchases of Pacific Northwest lumber 157 per cent.

The east coast of South America which has been dominated by Southern pine for many years, has at last started buying heavily in fir and spruce, increasing its use of Pacific Northwest lumber 425 per cent. Cuba has also been active with an increase of 150 per cent.

Europe also is beginning to show a keen interest in Pacific Northwest forest products, purchase for the united kingdom and continent, the first nine months this year having increased 58 per cent over the like period of last year.

South Africa, taking about half the volume purchased by Europe, shows an increase of 241 per cent for the comparative nine month period under review.

The figures are from the quarterly report of the Pacific Lumber Inspection bureau which inspected 93 per cent of all the cargo business to October 1 this year.

## American Legion

Question—Is the cash bonus a property right or a personal right that passes to next of kin?  
Sult filed by Department of Oregon, American Legion, in behalf of Margaret Crane as administrator of the estate of her husband, to determine whether the bonus is a property right to be administered as a part of an estate or a personal right that passes to the next of kin as named in the law. Decision of Judges Bingham and Kelly of Circuit Court of Marion county on May 6th to the effect that it is a personal right. Appealed to Supreme court.

Decision—The supreme court decided that if the bonus is not paid to the applicant in his lifetime, and such applicant leaves surviving him the relatives named in the statute, the bonus must be paid to such relatives in the order designated by the statute, i.e., the next of kin but not the administrator of the estate.

Question—Are the relatives of deceased veterans entitled to the loan?  
Sult filed by Department of Oregon, American Legion, in behalf of Sallie Carson to determine whether or not relatives of deceased veterans are entitled to the loan. Decision of Judges Bingham and Kelly of Circuit Court of Marion county on May 6th to the effect that relatives are entitled to the loan. Appealed to the supreme court.

Decision—The supreme court decided that relatives of deceased veterans are not entitled to the loan, but are entitled to the cash bonus only.

Question—Is a call to active duty from the reserve to be considered as an original entry into the service to establish eligibility?  
Sult filed by Department of Oregon, American Legion, in behalf of William P. Paulman to determine whether a call to active duty from the reserve is considered an original entry into the service to establish eligibility. Decision of Judges Bingham and Kelly of Marion county circuit court on May 25th in the negative. Appealed to supreme court.

Decision—The supreme court decided that anyone who was enlisted before June 3, 1915, and was, at and before June 2, 1915, and until after November 11, 1918, a soldier in the regular army of the United States, and whose entire service was performed under an enlistment made before June 3, 1915, does not come within the prescribed class defined in Article XI-c, and is not entitled to share in or receive any money authorized under the Article XI-c. In 1916, the court further stated: "We can see no reason, however, why it is not within the purview of the law, if deemed appropriate, to provide compensation to the claimant out of funds other than those created pursuant to the provisions of Article XI-c and Chapter 201, Laws 1921."

Question—Can the proceeds received from a loan be used for investment?
