

POLAND PLEASED WITH INDEPENDENCE GAINED FOR NATION

PHILADELPHIA, Nov. 14.—Poland is viewing its approaching republicanism with a joy and patriotic fervor much like that which swept over the American colonies when they set up the world's first representative form of government.

"The people of Poland are exhilarated over their independence and look forward with much expectancy to their first election in the next few weeks," said Dr. St. Phalle in an interview.

Dr. St. Phalle said Poland, France, Belgium, Rumania, Czechoslovakia, and Yugoslavia are closely allied in principle and wish only to keep the territory they have and to maintain peaceful relations with other countries.

"Poland is one of America's best future markets," he said. "Today it is buying cotton, copper, steel, machinery and locomotives from the United States."

VOTERS DECIDE BIG ISSUES AT ELECTION POLLS

as at present, was beaten by a majority estimated at more than 3700, while another proposition on the ballot, which in effect ratifies the present Nevada divorce laws and forbids altering them for a period of three years, had a majority of about 3200.

The Montana initiative measure to allow the use of pari mutual betting machines for horse races at state and county fairs apparently was carried as it had a majority yesterday of 2108 with 45,105 votes reported.

Veterans' welfare legislation was successful in both California and Montana. A soldiers' bonus passed by the Montana legislature had a 6500 majority on a referendum vote, and the California voters approved acts of the legislature calling for the issuance of bonds up to \$10,000,000 to enable veterans to buy farms and homes on easy terms.

On Medical Problems

The voters expressed their opinion in several far western states on questions of medical attention and public health. Osteopaths and chiropractors won the right in California to have licenses issued by examining boards of their own instead of by the state board of medical examiners.
