Stockton Unemployment Will Show Decrease

STOCKTON, Cal., Nov. 15.—Unemployment will not be as great here this winter as it was a year ago, according to Frank W. Waterman, manager of the Stockton office of the state employment system.

The fact that a great deal of construction work is planned for Stockton and vicinity will have much to do with decreasing unemployment, Waterman said.

During one recent week the bureau placed about 135 per cent more men than during the corresponding week of 1921. Sixty per cent were placed on farms.
