

NOTICE OF MEETING

Of the Tax Levying Board (being the County Court) of Klamath County, Oregon for the purpose of discussing with the taxpayers of said County the Budget for the year 1923.

The following estimates of expenses and probable receipts for the several offices and departments for the year 1923 were prepared by the Budget Committee of Klamath County, Oregon, consisting of the said County Court and three resident taxpayers duly appointed on said Budget Committee in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 118 Laws of Oregon for 1921.
