

**PROGRESS SHOWN  
IN ADVANCEMENT OF  
NEGROES IN AMERICA**

CINCINNATI, O., Dec. 4.—More has been accomplished in the last three years for the education and advancement of the negroes in America, upon which the board of education for negroes of the Methodist Episcopal church has expended \$2,000,000 during that time, than during any other like period in the history of the race, according to Dr. L. Garland Penn, one of the corresponding secretaries of the board.

The money expended by the board has been used in erecting new buildings, enlarging endowments, advancing teachers' salaries and equipment, he said.

"Every building in the nineteen institutions receiving aid from the board has been repaired and improved, in some cases receiving the first coat of paint in years," Dr. Penn said. "Housing plans have been installed and the general comfort of the students increased, as well as the greater safety for life and property."

"Several properties have been purchased, one each at Nashville, Tenn., Mex., Owensboro, N. C., Baltimore, Md., Holly Springs, Miss., and Orangeburg, S. C. In other institutions additions have been made to existing buildings and equipment."

The current expenditures of the institutions amount to \$1,941,000 for the school year, twice the sum expended five years ago.

Languidly the young man looked up and in a tone of infinite longing, replied:


"No, Rio Janeiro."

### HERBERT HOOVER IS HONORED BY BELGIUM WITH BRONZE STATUE

STANFORD UNIVERSITY, Calif., Dec. 4.—Belgium through an official representative formally dedicated here today a bronze statue set up on the Stanford university campus in recognition of the humanitarian services rendered to the Belgian nation during the world war by Secretary Herbert Hoover, a Stanford graduate. The gift was purchased through small contributions from the Belgian people, including children.

The statue, the work of a Belgian sculptor, represents the Egyptian goddess Isis, who typified the spirit of motherhood, the growing grain and the benevolent forces of humanity eternally in conflict with evil. The goddess, of more than life size, is pictured seated on a throne, with her features partly concealed by a veil.

Formal presentation was made by Senator Albert Lameire of Belgium, who was designated by his government and came from his native land for this purpose. Frank Deering, San Francisco, a member of the university board of trustees, formally accepted the gift. Dr. Ray Lyman Wilbur, president of Stanford and others, made addresses.

The dedicating ceremonies were held in the Stanford chapel, famous for its gilded monies. Much of the chancel being a Belgian flag carried by Stanford men who saw service in Belgium during the war. The college glee club sang the Belgian national anthem and America.

The statue has been placed temporarily in the Stanford Art Gallery pending the erection of the war memorial building, where it will be permanently located.
