Mr. and Mrs. William McCollum, who have been in town visiting Mrs. Katherine Wright for the past week, left this morning for their home in Dorris, California.

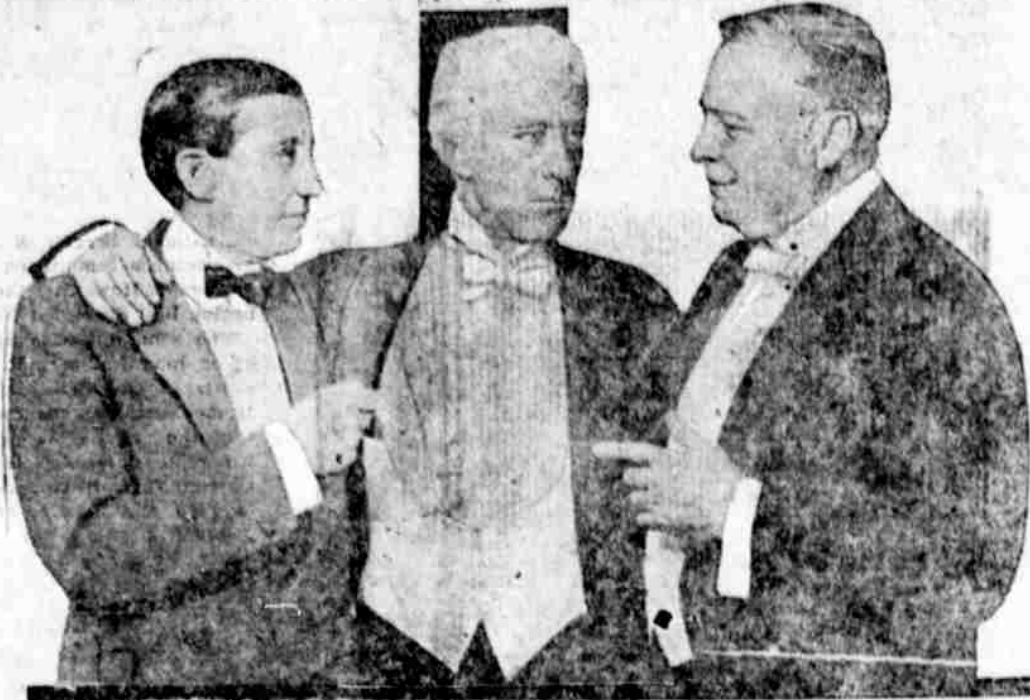

GENIUS IS BORN OF MIXED BLOOD

SAN FRANCISCO, Dec. 7.—Science has declared that the children of an American mother and Japanese father are, in fact, in the "genius" class...

The test was made by the department of psychology of Stanford university on the children of Helen Francis Emery, daughter of the late Archbishop John A. Emery of the Episcopal church...

Four children were born to Mr. and Mrs. Aoki. They are: Sophronia Frances, the oldest, aged 13; John, aged 11, Dorothy, aged 10...

and Donald, aged 8. A fifth child, one year old, was not tested. Sophronia and John are in the first year of high school...

The Stanford department has been carrying out extensive tests of the psychological fitness of Japanese children in California...

Both in the portions of the test which called for information and observation and in the portions which tried out the basic speed, attention capacity and reasoning powers...

1,560,000 EASTERN BROOK TROUT SPAWN TAKEN AT HATCHERY

NEW YORK, Wash., Dec. 7.—The King's lake fish hatchery here is just completing gathering the largest number of eastern brook trout spawn in the history of the hatchery...

The brook trout which have made King's lake and North and South Shookum lakes famous in the northwest are still running and are being caught in a net under the ice at the mouth of the trap by Game Warden Eastwell.

The hatching capacity of the King's lake plant is 400,000, and so the remainder of the spawn will be sent to the new state hatchery at Metairie Falls...

W. B. Dingle of Newport, chairman of the county game commission, has received word that the state will furnish Ford Orville county with 250,000 Mackinaw trout direct from Michigan...

PROPOSED FEDERAL GAME BILL OPPOSED BY COMMISSIONERS

Resolution Censuring Measure Is Adopted at Conference After Long and Bitter Debate

SACRAMENTO, Dec. 7.—A resolution opposing the passage of the federal public shooting and game refuge bill now pending before congress was adopted here Tuesday...

This action was taken after a long and bitter debate, several members of the association contending that the bill provided means of eliminating the destruction of migratory birds...

Need Not Seen It was held in the resolution that there was "no crying need for public shooting grounds or bird refuges in the northwest..."

Incidentally a slip was taken in the resolution of the American Game Protective association and the California Fish, Game and Forest protective league...

"Tired of Being Deceived" "Already the west is tired of being deceived as to its operation and its control of natural resources by Fifth avenue, New York..."

"A large percentage of people do not know there is such a bill before congress and if they did know its provisions, particularly that demanding an additional license...

Violation of Rights "This is class legislation, not for the best interests of the states but on the contrary, clearly a violation of the sovereign rights of the states..."

The resolution was signed by L. E. Bean and Otto M. Jones, game commissioners of Oregon and Idaho, respectively. Previous to its adoption, a telegram was received from the California Fish, Game and Forest Protective league...

Another resolution adopted, favored legislation by which states in which game or fur shipped from another state is seized, would be compelled to turn over the contraband game or fur to the state in which it originated.

Uniform Laws Urged More uniform license laws between states, and laws to control predatory birds now protected under the migratory bird treaty were urged in other resolutions.

The following officers were chosen: C. A. Jakways of Helena, Montana, president; Frank Nowbert of Sacramento, vice president; R. H. Hill of Helena, Mont., secretary-treasurer.

The next conference will be held at Gardiner, Mont., September 17.
