

HAWAII WEATHERED WORST FINANCIAL, INDUSTRIAL STORM

WASHINGTON, Dec. 9.—During the last fiscal year ended June 30 the Territory of Hawaii successfully weathered one of the most critical industrial and financial periods of its history.

Conservative policies that have always controlled the business of the territory were declared by the governor to be the barrier that checked an era of widespread disaster.

General business conditions now have improved as the result of a more normal world price for raw sugar, the product from which Hawaii derives its prosperity.

Raw sugar and pineapples continued through the year to hold first place in the food crops of Hawaii. The yield of sugar for the calendar year 1922 was estimated at 546,844 tons.

Hawaii is an integral unit of the United States, although not enjoying statehood, the report said, and as such pays into the federal treasury an amount of \$16,597,917.

The Hawaiian home commission was inaugurated with President Harding's approval in July, 1921, and was a radical departure in administration of the public lands under control of the territory.

Health conditions were good during the year, and treatment of leprosy with chaulmoogra oil derivatives continued with good success.
