

NEW 20-STORY BUILDING, S. F.

Great Grey Structure of Standard Oil Dominates Skyline

SAN FRANCISCO, Dec. 11.—A great gray office building, twenty-two stories high, has just taken from other downtown skyscrapers the dominating place on the San Francisco skyline.

The building—a huge monument to California oil—was constructed by the Standard Oil company of California and will house the firm's head offices here.

Architects describe the new structure as a palace of medieval Florence set down in modern California and that is perhaps the finest office building west of Chicago.

Down in the cornerstone repose 110 typewritten sheets, containing the names of 16,000 men and women employed by the company. Of these, 11,000 are Standard Oil stockholders.

The area of the structure is 38,335 square feet, with a frontage of 137 feet on Bush street and 206 feet on Sansome street. The total floor area is 423,000 square feet. The building weighs 96,965,000 pounds and there are 12,000,000 pounds of steel in it. The largest number of men employed at one time was 450.

The entrance lobby, not completed.

ed., will be finished in marble and bronze with nine twenty-passenger capacity elevators. Granite and terra cotta compose the outer surface.

The twentieth story is peculiar in that it consists of a massive cornice, taking up the entire floor, with windows concealed so as to effect the Florentine castle that suggested the design. Above this cornice or battlement rises a classic facade, two stories high, with Ionic columns.

Various departments of the company will at once occupy all but five stories of the new structure. Being moved from the old twelve-story Standard Oil building nearby.

SUES OIL COMPANY

E. J. Lawrence Seeking Payment of \$324.80 for Services

Suit brought by E. J. Lawrence against the Crater Oil and Gas company came to trial in the circuit court this morning. Lawrence is attempting to obtain \$324.80, alleged due him from the company.

The main issue is not whether the Crater Oil and Gas company owes the \$324.80, but whether Lawrence had agreed to take stock in the company as payment for his services. The defendant claims such an agreement was entered into with the plaintiff, while on the other hand Lawrence alleges that there was never an arrangement of that sort.

At 1:30 this afternoon final arguments were presented by the attorneys and it was expected the case would go to the jury shortly thereafter.

INCOME TAX IS DUE

December 15 Last Day for Paying Fourth Installment for 1921

PORTLAND, Dec. 11.—Taxpayers are reminded that Friday, December 15, is the last day for paying the fourth and final installment of their 1921 income tax," said Clyde G. Huntley, collector of internal revenue, today. "Unless the balance of his tax is paid by that time, the taxpayer will be liable to the payment of both penalty and interest charges because of his delinquency." Those unpaid taxes, if mailed, must be posted in time to reach the office of Collector Huntley not later than midnight next Friday. The receiving stamp on the envelope will be accepted by the collector as the actual time of delivery.
