LEGAL BATTLE OVER TITLE TO LANDS STARTED

(Continued from Page 1)

land and was also responsible of transfer of title to Marsters. The legislation failed, however, and the waters were not lowered.

Attacks State's Methods

Eddy attacked the state for prosecuting the case 19 years after the lands were located.

Reames made a brief statement for the land company in which he declared that the burden of proof as to the good faith of the company in purchasing the lands from Marsters rested with the state. He said that the present owners of the land had made valuable improvements which had increased the value of the lands, and declared his belief that the state had become cognizant of this fact and had sought this means for regaining title.

The first clash between the opposing attorneys occurred when Lilljevist requested of the court that a subpoena be issued for A. O. Rose of Roseburg as witness. Eddy declared that the state's attorney had had plenty of opportunity to question Rose while in Roseburg, and that Rose was an old man of 80 years whose memory was failing. He added that as a member of the state legislature he had voted for \$25,000 to prosecute land fraud cases, but that if he had known that such "small pettifoggery" would be resorted to by the state, he would not have voted for one cent.

Crawford seconded Eddy's statements, adding that the request of the state was nothing less than a trick and a ruse. He defied the state's attorney to bring contempt proceedings, as Lilljevist had threatened to do.

Judge Leavitt settled the question of issuing a subpoena for Rose by directing the bailiff to call Rose's name three times in the corridor.
