Strengthened Conviction

West, in general, expressed the idea that his Washington trip had strengthened his conviction that the original support given by the chamber of commerce to the Southern Pacific was best for local development.

Before he took part in the hearing, said West, he had a conference with Southern Pacific officials, in which Paul Shoup, vice president, promised that he would come to Klamath Falls next spring, when road conditions made a trip possible, and would journey over the proposed route to Westwood, to see what ton-

nage was available and what potential tonnage the country afforded. Officials Extend Hope

If the survey warranted a railway, providing the Southern and Central Pacific were not unmerged, West said the railway officials extended hope that the road would be built.

**'Story of Mankind' Is
Most Important Book**

CHICAGO, Dec. 20.—The "Story of Mankind," by Henrik Van Loon, has been voted the most important book published in 1921 by the Children's Librarians section of the American Library association. Out of 212 votes received by the chairman of that section, Van Loon's book received 164, with no other book receiving more than 22.

In accordance with the vote, Van Loon was awarded the John Newbery medal, the gift of Frederic C. Melcher, by the children's librarians section at Detroit. It is considered probable that the medal will be awarded annually in the future by this section.
