Snow Leads to Discovery of Stills in Clatsop County

TAUOMA, Dec. 21.—The heavy snow that has covered the outlying sections of Grays Harbor county, has resulted in the arrest of a number of alleged moonshiners, the capture of a dozen stills, and the confiscation of hundreds of gallons of liquor and mash, according to announcement here today.

The drive was conducted by federal agents and deputy sheriffs of Grays Harbor county, who in several instances, were able to follow tracks through the snow to the location of stills. The raids were made in the wooded sections of the county where it had heretofore been impossible to locate the liquor manufacturing activities that were known to exist.
