TO OPEN U. S. LANDS

Tract of 6,302 Acres in Siskiyou County to Be Subject to Entry

YREKA, Dec. 30.—Notice has been given by John C. Ing of Sacramento, registrar of the United States land office, that plats of survey for 6,302.30 acres of land lying ten miles south of the Oregon line in Modoc national forest, Siskiyou county, have been received. They will be officially filed February 1.

This land is contained in fractional sections of townships 48 north, range 2 east, and 46 north range 3 east, the latter including the Modoc forest principally. These will be subject to entry by those who established residence prior to the date of the inclusion of the lands within the Modoc national forest. Lands in township 46 north, range 2 east, will be subject to entry on and after February 1, 1923.

Persons who claim prior settlement on the unreserved land must file their claims within 90 days from February 1, 1923.

Anyone interested in taking up a homestead in that section of the county wishing further particulars can get the proper information by communicating with John C. Ing, registrar of the United States land office, Sacramento.

Farming a Business

"Farmer Smith says: 'Farming is no longer a means of obtaining a mere living. It is a business proposition that calls for keen business management. Study and know your business in detail. Do a few of the things that you have been going to do for the past twenty years. Take care of your farm machinery. Use a little care in the selection and planting of seed. Get rid of your scrub hogs, cows, pigs, sheep and chickens. Don't board dead-heads, you can't afford to do it. don't keep hogs, there is money in pigs, but none in hogs. And learn proper feeding methods—and join and take an active part in your farmers organizations. The education derived therefrom will more than repay you for any time devoted along this line.' You cannot deny but that Farmer Smith's advice is sound. He knows what he is talking about when he talks on farming matters.
