NATIONAL PARK BISON GROWING

LIVINGSTON, Mont., July 20.—Starting in 1902 with twenty-five animals, the Yellowstone national park herd of bison has increased to 670. Horace A. Albright, superintendent of the park, announced here. Ninety buffalo were born in the park last winter, he said. There are 14,000 buffalo in the United States at present, a sufficient number to insure that the species will never become extinct, Albright says.

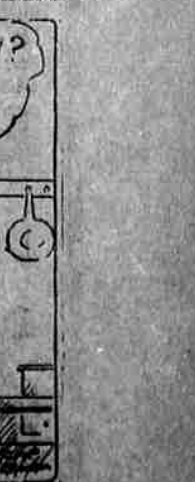
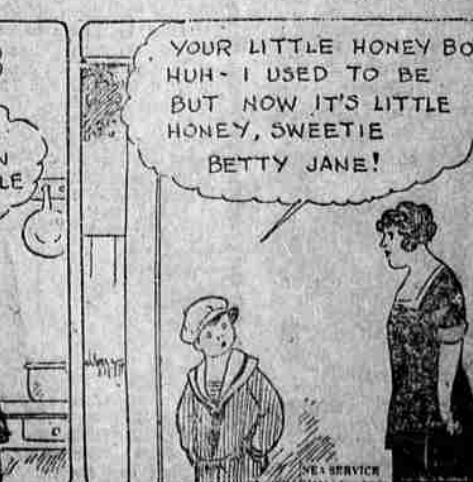
