ONLY 4,000,000 ABOVE NORMAL IN U. S., ASSERTS PROFESSOR

LOS ANGELES, Calif., July 30.—Ninety-six per cent of the people of the United States are below the accepted standard of intelligence, and only 4,000,000 are above the standard, Dr. R. B. Von Klein Smid, president of the University of Southern California, declared here in an address to the student body at the summer session.

The sixty-six per cent below standard, or approximately 36,000,000, seem likely to increase to 38,000,000, and the 4,000,000 decrease to 3,000,000, Dr. Von Klein Smid declared.

The primary work of the college or university is to deal with the 4,000,000 and to train the people of superior intelligence that they may become leaders in the future.

"Frankly, I do not know who shall come to college," Dr. Von Klein Smid said. "I am at loss to accept any kind of a criterion which shall limit college entrance to any group. He the tests of the future what they may, the ideal of the college must be to conserve the intellectual ideals and to pass them on so that they may send out leaders for the generations to come."

BUENOS AIRES, July 30.—Public squares and parks of the city of Buenos Aires soon will be provided with small public libraries set up in the open air.

## SCIENTISTS PREPARING FOR TRIP TO AUSTRALIA

EUGENE, Ore., July 30.—Leading scientists of Australia, Japan, China, Siberia, India, Burma, Netherlands-Indies, Canada and the United States, will attend the second Pan-Pacific scientific congress at Sydney and Melbourne, Australia, from August 13 to September 3, according to Dr. Warren D. Smith, head of the University of Oregon department of geology. Dr. Smith will attend the international meet, which will be held under the direction of the Australian research council, and will include addresses in all fields of science.

Dr. Smith, who for more than ten years was chief of the division of mines of the bureau of science of the Philippines, will speak of "Structure of the Philippines," and the "Status of Geological Surveys in the Philippines."

The scientific congress is part of a general program of welding together the peoples of the Pacific, and the meeting is expected to aid in the movement for international peace.
