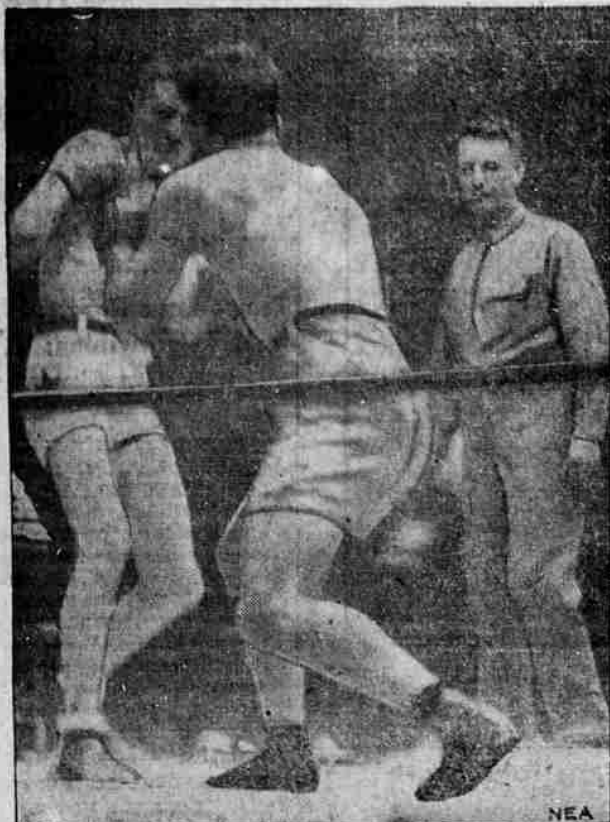

Johnny Dundee Wins Title

IN LIVELY MIX-UP IN SIXTH ROUND



Here is pictured the fighting face of Eugene Criqui, the Frenchman who less than two months ago took the world's featherweight championship from the veteran title holder, Johnny Kilbane. His back to the camera, Johnny Dundee, American challenger, is shown battering the slipping champion in the sixth round of a 15-round fight at the Polo Grounds, New York, in which Dundee won the decision and the championship. Criqui, already knocked down several times, had rushed Dundee to the ropes, only to be driven back.

BOXER FINDS GAME SLOW IN KLAMATH; GOING TO FRISCO

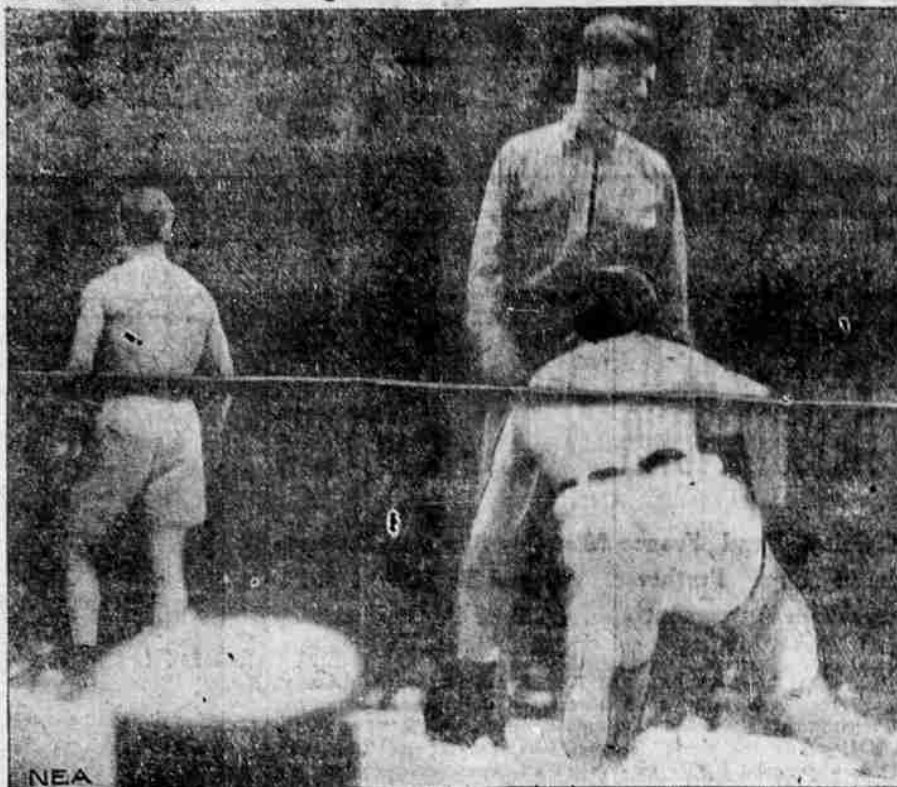

DUNDEE FLOORS CRIQUI IN FIRST ROUND OF TITLE BOUT



Johnny Dundee, new featherweight champion of the world, is shown in this night picture of a spectacular battle at the Polo Grounds, New York, with Eugene Criqui, French title holder, just after having floored his opponent for the first time. A right to the jaw put Criqui down for the count of nine in the first round. Dundee is shown walking to his corner as the referee counted over the fallen champion who came up feebly before the bell rang and managed to stay the 15 rounds, though losing the decision.

MINES TO BE OPENED

Efforts of 14 Years To Be Rewarded in Idaho Region

LEONIA, Idaho, Aug. 2.—Crowding 14 years of effort, by which seemingly insurmountable difficulties have been overcome, big-scale hydraulic mining operations are expected to be started within a few days on the Idaho gold and ruby mine, near here. The hydraulic mining adventure is said to be the largest ever attempted in any part of the world.

Twenty miles of roads were dug

by steam shovel, six miles of ditch were constructed, dams and pipelines were installed, and a permanent mill was built for receiving fine gold and black sands, in the 14 years of preparation for operations. sluice boxes are being put in the bed rock in the main canyon, and the bottom of the canyon is being cleaned up from a point about 100 feet upstream from the top of the big cut, in readiness for the expected clean-up of yellow treasure.
