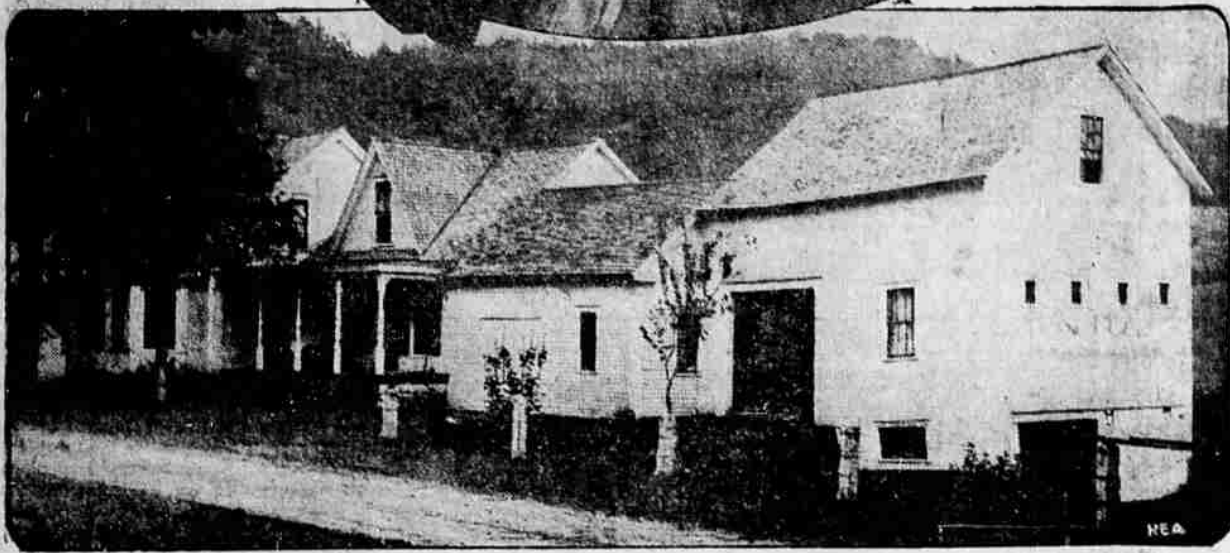

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NEW U. S. SURVEY FOR DAM SITES

MOAB, Utah, Aug. 11.—Armed with a radio outfit and motion picture equipment, ten engineers of the United States geological survey have departed on a trip to map the entire length of the Colorado river, which, it is said, will take them over hitherto unexplored sections of the lower fastnesses of the canyon and require more than four months to complete. The work will have a bearing on the dams proposed in the canyon of the Colorado, flood prevention and conservation of Colorado river waters now

believed to be wasted. Four experienced river boatmen have been engaged to pilot the expedition. Similar work has been going on at both ends of the canyon for a number of years, but the party is expected to map and survey gorges, streams and canyons hitherto uncharted.

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DISCOVER ISLE RACE NATIVITY

Evidence of Former Habitation Found By Scientists In Hawaiians

HONOLULU, T. H., Aug. 11.—

Scientific data and specimens that are expected to prove of invaluable aid in solving the problem of the origin and the migrations of the Polynesian race were brought to Honolulu by the scientific and naval party which has just completed the third month of investigation in the Bird Island reservation, several hundred miles north of the Hawaiian group, and on neighboring isles and atolls, aboard the naval mine sweeper Tanager.

Evidence of former habitation was discovered on the small island of Necker, where a community apparently had established itself in a series of caves on the side of a sheer cliff. A number of stone implements and bowls, and several human bones were found there. The caves were difficult of access, as only one man could creep on the pathway at a time around the jutting rocks along the cliff, the scientists said.

The expedition gathered enough material to merit several months of further study, according to Dr. H. E. Gregory, director of the Bishop museum, who is in charge of the expeditions.

The scientists told of the island of Kaula with a circumference of approximately a mile which was literally covered with millions of birds. The Tanager, sounding her siren in steaming around the island, aroused the birds until they covered the skyline like a cloud.

The fourth and final expedition of the series started the other day aboard the destroyers Burns and Ludlow and the mine sweeper Walpoorwill for Johnston island, approximately 800 miles due west of the Hawaiian group. After some time here the expedition will move to Wake island approximately 1800 miles west of Honolulu. Practically nothing is known of Wake island, Dr. Gregory said.

NEW SUBWAY IN SAN FRANCISCO

SAN FRANCISCO, Aug. 11.—Construction of a vehicular subway under the loop at the ferry building here to relieve congestion at one of the busiest transportation terminals in the world, will be started shortly by the state board of harbor commissioners. The tube, which will be wide enough for two motor cars abreast, is expected to be completed within ten months from the time actual construction is begun. The cost will be \$400,000, half of which will be borne by the state, one-fourth by the Market Street Railroad company and the remaining fourth by the city.

Officials estimate that the new subway will speed up street car traffic at this point 50 per cent, and accelerate the transportation of

freight from the docks on either side of the ferry building by 30 per cent.
