PERPETUAL AIR
CURRENT FOUND

CHICAGO, Aug. 18.—A direct R. Ford, a local baker, is exhibiting a new power device which he claims will revolutionize industry and operate anything from an automobile to a warship. The invention consists of a tube, in which are a number of "windmills," and longitudinal plates guide a current of air from one to another. A current is sent through the tube from an electric fan, operating the windmills, which in turn generate power.

Ford says the several windmills will create enough power to keep the fan going, once they are started, thus providing a perpetual source of activity. A model of the machine tested here has developed enough power to move against the current of air operating it, Ford says. The inventor says scientists have long sought to make the same air currents operate a series of windmills, one behind the other, and that he has solved the secret by the design of the plates between each mill. The power developed by the first mill may thus be increased as many times as succeeding mills are provided, Ford asserts.
