"The London policeman knows his London and directs you promptly, politely, and accurately, without waste of words.

"The Londoner does not push, crowd or hustle, but he knows where he is going, and will gladly help you get where you are going in an orderly, comfortable and quick way.

"So if one were to check up on the question I would say that for all the London's apparent deliberation, he is moving towards his destination as quickly as any New Yorker, and making far less hubbub about it.

"It is this quiet efficiency that is misleading, and is so often mistaken for slowness."

INCREASED USE OF ALCOHOL PROTESTED

BERLIN, Aug. 22.—German professors of hygiene have criticized the increase of alcoholism in Germany in a memorial addressed to the various governments urging that further steps be taken to conserve the national foodstuffs now used in making liquor, and to protect public health against the increasing consumption of alcohol.

Doctor I. A. H. Selter, director of the hygiene institute of the University of Koeln, issued the memorial on behalf of the society of German professors of hygiene. The document suggests an absolute prohibition of the use of foodstuffs, especially grain, potatoes and sugar, in the manufacture of alcoholic liquors.

"It cannot be contested," the memorial says, "that the production of alcohol deprives the German people of great quantities of foodstuffs. But it is not this fact alone which causes us to raise a voice of warning. We know by experience that

malnutrition fosters alcoholism, and that, on the other hand, increasing alcoholism has a double effect on underfed people. We therefore ask the government to control, with all means at its disposal, the increasing consumption of alcohol. By this means the collapse of feeding can be prevented.

Dr. Selter produces Prussian statistics to show that the use of alcohol is on the increase.

Shortly after the publication of this memorial, it was announced that producers of alcoholic spirits in Germany had decided to stop using potatoes in their distilleries, and would at once turn over to the food markets all existing supplies.

ROUMANIAN PRINCE MAY ASCEND THRONE

VALONA, Albania, Aug. 22.—The support which Albania is receiving from Roumania for admission to the Little Entente at the conference at Sciaia, in Roumania, has given new impetus to the candidacy of Prince Nikolai of Roumania for the throne of Albania, which the prince of Wied vacated at the beginning of the world war.

Several of the notables of the Albanian tribes have announced their support of Prince Nikolai's aspirations, on the ground that a relationship with the Roumanian court would greatly assist Albania to achieve its reconstruction.

Prince Nikolai is the younger son of Queen Marie of Roumania, and is once removed from the Roumanian throne by his brother, Prince Carol, the eldest son. It is known that Queen Marie is backing her younger son's endeavors to become prince of Albania.

AMERICAN PRAISES ENGLISH CUSTOMS

LONDON, Aug. 22.—London newspapers have contained many articles of late about things that are better done in America, and especially in New York, than they are here. Englishmen have been told in effect by the writers of these articles that they should not consider themselves properly educated until they have been to America and found out how much they don't know.

And now by way of contrast, it would seem, an American business man, W. S. Ashby, tells in the Daily Chronicle of various things he has seen here which are much better done than in New York. Especially does he commend the handling of the street traffic in London as compared with New York's way of doing it.

"The first thing to impress one on arriving from New York," he said, "is the quiet and absence of hurry. At first thought one might surmise that the English are slow, and we have had enough reports to that effect to warrant our thinking so.

"But first impressions, while vivid, are wrong.

"There is an absence of bustle and noise, but no appreciable sacrifice of speed.

"At the crossings there is no shrilling of traffic officer's whistles.

Local authorities, recognizing the desperate nature of the situation, are struggling to ameliorate it. The municipal council has appointed a committee to confer with the minister of transportation and the agriculture committee of the senate to seek a solution of the problem.

Street fairs which were eschewed in every section of the city a little more than a year ago have become tremendously popular institutions. Food staples and articles of clothing and household use sold at these fairs at prices considerably lower than prevail in stores. Rich as well as poor patronize them. It is no uncommon sight to see a richly dressed lady alight from a limousine with her purchases at a street fair.

Two or three of the popular newspapers have been conducting campaigns against what they term the Ditty Tragedy, in which for weeks they have covered their front pages with pictures and heartrending stories of the poverty and misery that is found in all parts of the city, and which they assert has not been equaled here in modern times.

In contrast to these gloomy pictures, however, is the undeniable fact that never in Rio's history has there been such display of wealth and luxury on the city's downtown streets as at present. The Avenida Branco, on any pleasant afternoon, is almost impassable because of the fashionably dressed crowds that throng its sidewalks. Silks and jewels are conspicuous, and priced automobiles pass in procession. The shop windows are lavishly in their displays of goods, sold at fabulous prices. Motion picture shows, theatres, and amusement clubs are crowded to capacity by pleasure seekers.

There is little unemployment, and wages have not increased in proportion to prices, there have been no strikes nor serious talk of strikes for more than two years. The increasing flow of immigration from Europe, both manufacturing and agricultural interests claim that they are unable to obtain or expand their activities because of labor shortage.

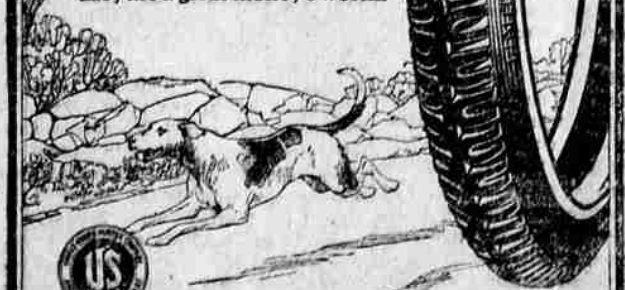
