FASCIST RULE PROVES SUCCESS

ROME, Oct. 5.—As the first year of Fascist rule in Italy draws to a close, it is interesting to consider what has been accomplished in the agriculture and industrial life of the nation. It is believed that the increased energy and confidence on the part of landowners and farmers, together with favorable weather conditions, has started Italy on the road to greater production and prosperity.

The number of unemployed has steadily declined, the official returns for the months of March and April, 1923, show a reduction of almost one half as compared to the corresponding months of 1922.

There have been practically no strikes or labor troubles since the Fascists and their leader undertook to run the Government of Italy last October. The Ministry of Agriculture estimates that the gross value of Italy's crops for 1923 will exceed that of 1922 by about 4,000,000,000 and individuals of this country.

that the yields of wheat, barley and rye are about 23 percent higher than in 1922, and from 19 to 23 percent higher than that of the average for the last five years. In addition forage crops, silk cocoons, vines, sugar beets and tomatoes have all been more extensively cultivated and have yielded larger crops.

AMERICAN EXPORTERS WIN FIFTH PRIZE

RIO DE JANEIRO, Oct. 5.—American exporters occupied fifth place in the number of prizes that were awarded foreign exhibitors at the Brazilian Centennial Exposition in this city, which closed late in July according to official figures. Prizes were awarded to foreign exhibitors as follows: France 545, Belgium 211, Portugal 201, Italy 180, United States 147, England 110, Argentina 108, Luxembourg 79, Denmark 47, Japan 45, Norway 22, and Czechoslovakia 21.

There was a total of 9,926 exhibits from foreign countries and 6,013 from Brazil, of which 898 belonged to state and municipal governments and the rest to companies that of 1922 by about 4,000,000,000 and individuals of this country.

The official figures place the total attendance of the exposition at 3,626,402, or an average of 12,723 persons a day from the time it opened September 7, 1922.
