

# American Legion

SAN FRANCISCO, Oct. 6.—Down a "Path of Victory" along Market street, beneath fluttering streamers of American and allied flags, 150,000 delegates and guests of the American legion national convention will be walking in little more than two weeks.

From the opening day of the convention, Oct. 15, until the close on the night of Oct. 19, the city will be given over to the veterans. Forty thousand billets have been reserved in 200 hotels, parking space for visiting cavalades of automobiles has been provided for, and the Pacific fleet has arranged for arrival a day or two in advance of the big conclave.

To relieve the strain of convention meetings, at which some of the most important problems facing America will be considered, dozens of diversions have been arranged. Athletic events, including a national track and field meet of some of the best stars; a basketball tournament golf and tennis tourney, the latter directed by William F. Johnson, San Francisco, winner of the Wimbledon championship; an exhibition baseball game and at least one football game between Legion stars, will be featured. Then there will be an airplane and glider contest on Crissy field, with 50 or more national aces competing; a \$2,000 prize contest for the best delegate band and bugle corps out of the 100 or more musical organizations present, and a beauty contest, with 60 yeomanettes of Washington, D. C. issuing a challenge to all comers.

General Hunter Liggett, general

convention committee head, is tying in the last details of the vast organization task. The drop of National Commander Alvin Owsley's gavel will start the following program, which is still being added to:

Monday, Oct. 16, morning: Addresses of welcome by Mayor Ralph, Governor Richardson, James Collins, California department commander, Secretary of Labor James J. Davis, Admiral R. E. Coontz and General Joseph Haller, chief of the Polish armies, who will be an honored guest.

Memorial services, including taps: AFTERNOON Opening of conventions of Legion Auxiliary and "Forty and Eight," the playground society of the Legion. Reunions of 50 or more divisional and regimental organizations.

EVENING Dancing in downtown halls for which thousands of pretty San Francisco girls will act as partners. Tuesday, Oct. 16, morning: Military parade, with 50,000 men in line, forming the largest military procession ever staged in the west.

AFTERNOON Main athletic program, together with sight-seeing trips for which many hundreds of cars will be volunteered by citizens.

EVENING High jinks and smoker for Legionnaires, "Stagers" party for women. Wednesday, Oct. 17, morning: Addresses by Kate Haller Barrett, national president of Legion Auxil-

ary and Frank H. Hines, director Veterans bureau.

AFTERNOON Military review by Presidio army units. Dedication of monuments to war dead.

EVENING Fleet night. Illumination of Pacific fleet and dances aboard. Thursday, Oct. 18, morning: Address by Samuel Gompers, president American Federation of Labor.

AFTERNOON Alameda county day: Oakland and other transbay cities. Beach parties, sight-seeing and dinners. Friday, Oct. 19. Election of officers and final grand ball.
