For School and Road Funds

One-fourth of the moneys received by the Forest Service from timber sales, grazing permits, summer home site leases, and other uses of National Forest lands is turned over to the States in which such lands are located on a pro rata basis, in accordance with an act of Congress. Such sums are for the school and road funds of the counties containing National Forest lands.

Oregon has received for roads and schools since 1909, as its share of National Forest receipts, a total of \$1,101,384.

HUGE SMELTER WILL RESUME

KENNETT, Cal., Oct. 8.—The Mammoth Copper company's smelter, which was shut down in May, 1919, will be started up early next month. This is the prediction made by O. J. Eggleston, general manager, who says 200 men are on the payroll now. The work of repairing at the mines and smelter and putting the transportation system in shape has been going on for two months.

Ore extraction has been resumed at the Mammoth mine but only in a small way. Capacity production will not be undertaken until the smelter is ready to start. The smelter has three furnaces. The baghouse an all essential factor in handling the smoke is being put in better shape than ever before for during the period of shutdown important improvements have been made. The gravity tramline from mine to smelter is now all ready for service.

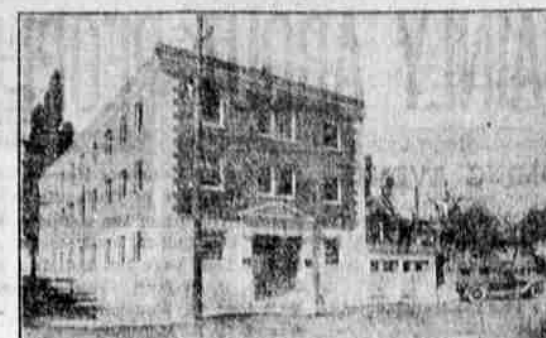
Ore from the Balakiala mine is to be treated also. The aerial tramline from Coram to the Balakiala is being repaired. Some new towers have to be put in. Ore is to be

shipped from the Keyatone mine also.

The Mammoth has been to heavy expense in getting ready the wage bill for between 200 and 300 men for over two months being a heavy item alone not mentioning the great sum expended for material. And during all this period not a single pound of copper has been produced.

S.P. WOULD BUY MORE FIR TIES

The Southern Pacific stands ready to buy all fir ties produced in this region according to J. J. Miller district freight and passenger agent. Geo. Borjast a purchasing agent, tried to buy ties here but without much success, most of those produced here being pine. At Dorris, Castella and Hilt he placed some orders. These ties, Borjast told Miller, are the best the Southern Pacific ever used, and the company is anxious to get more of the same quality. Out of four carloads the inspectors discarded but 11 ties. The loss was so small that the officials' attention was attracted, and it was decided that the fir of this region is better adapted to tie-making than that of many other coast regions.

OREGON GETS FEDERAL FUNDS

PORTLAND, Oct. 6.—The state of Oregon has received \$168,111.25

from the Forest Service, U. S. Department of Agriculture, as its share of the receipts from National forest resources during the fiscal year 1923 according to an announcement from the District Forester's office in Portland.
