Petitions have been received from the sporting organizations in some of these counties asking that the closed season be maintained on account of scarcity of these birds. The fish and game department then issued the order closing the season.

IDAHO ESCAPES FOREST FIRES

BOISE, Idaho, Oct. 16.—Idaho, for the most part has been free from fires this season, says the Idaho Statesman. While serious fires have occurred in many parts of the forested west only a few have been reported from Idaho and many national forests report that no fires at all have occurred.

The fire season is now near the end of its fire season and the fall rains should put an end to all danger of fire for several months at least, the officials say. Forest officers attribute the scarcity of fires a large measure to the propaganda carried in newspapers, cooperating with the United States Forest Service in lessening the fire hazard.
