

BANDITS TRAIL GROWS WARMER

Car Found in Vancouver, Wash., Believed Vehicle of Escape

VANCOUVER, Wash., Oct. 17.—A possible clue to the Siskiyou train robbers has been found in a six-passenger automobile which was abandoned here Saturday, two days after the holdup. It bore a Washington license and fitted the description of the car seen near the tunnel after the holdup.

Special agent P. E. Kelly of the Southern Pacific, found the car numbers filed off in the same manner as the number was filed from the revolver found at the holdup scene.

Kelly expressed the belief that the robbers used the car found here. He said "the trail is getting hot."

An overcoat with a pistol in the pocket was found on the street here last night. It was loaded with steel nosed bullets like those which killed the engineer and fireman of train No. 15.

SCIENCE CONQUERS SLEEPING SICKNESS

HAMBURG, Oct. 17.—Cures which strike the Congo natives as being more miraculous than those of biblical days are being performed on victims of sleeping sickness in Central Africa, according to Dr. Martin Mayer, of the Hamburg Tropical Institute, who was the first scientist to test a German remedy on sleeping sickness.

A German commission under the leadership of Dr. Klein is now in the tropical section of Africa applying the remedy. There are records of 170 Congo natives who have been treated. Only a few of these died, owing to brain and nerve complications. The others regained their strength, and declared they were as well as they ever had been.

Dr. Mayer is of the opinion that science has found a remedy which will make it possible to develop much territory in the tropics which has hitherto been closed because of the danger of sleeping sickness.

HOLLAND BUYING RUSSIAN GRAIN

MOSCOW, Oct. 17.—The rye surplus is selling faster than the wheat surplus. Several big parcels of rye have been shipped, one of them going to Holland, the price being \$2 to \$1 guineas a ton.

DR. H. A. KELLY AND ONE OF HIS PETS

BALTIMORE, Oct. 17.—Surgery, radium and—snakes.

Dr. Howard A. Kelly, world-famous surgeon and probably the foremost authority on radium in America, is a lover of snakes. He has caught thousands over a period of 62 years, and has been bitten by every variety of poisonous reptile of the continent.

Snakes take the place of dogs and cats in Dr. Kelly's household. A dozen roa mat libery through his four-story residence and rats and mice are unknown. He houses a seven foot Coluber Constrictor, or Highland Blacksnake, to dispose of the larger rodents and several Florida Corn Snakes make short shift of mice.

Recently the doctor, was heart broken when he discovered a King Snake had wandered from his balliwick in the dining room and made

breakfast of a Hog nosed viper, in the pantry.

Dr. Kelly is a charter member of a national society for the protection of reptile. Yearly he makes auto excursions to Baltimore's outskirts to repopulate snakes on Baltimore county farms. They are indispensable in diminishing rodents, he said, but he has yet to receive thanks from the farmers.

Recently Dr. Kelly returned from a camping vacation in Canada where he had made a vain search for a specimen of Storeria Ocellipomaculata. A few days before his return he shot a large hawk and as the bird fell it vomited forth a specimen of the rare reptile.

Dr. Kelly insists the venom of reptiles is greatly exaggerated. Last year in Florida he was bitten by a Copperhead and a companion was the victim of a rattler. Both recovered but the doctor admits he suffered for six weeks.

Asked whether Mrs. Kelly objected to reptiles, hop-skip-and-jumping over her carpets, Dr. Kelly replied she had cared for the collection of "pets" during his vacation, and all seemed fat and happy upon his return.

IRISH FREE STATE FUNDS GROWING

DUBLIN, Oct. 17.—The official figures of the Irish Free State revenue show that from the beginning of the financial year down to September, a period of five months, the exchequer received 13,369,000 pounds, as compared with 9,893,376 pounds in the corresponding period last year.

The return indicates that the budget estimated receipts of 26,000,000 pounds will be exceeded. On the other side of the account it appears that the expenditure was 14,474,852 pounds as compared with 7,293,229 pounds in the corresponding period last year. The ministry is being urged by the press to greater economy.

TEACHERS PAY RAISED, P. I. MANILA, Oct. 17.—More than 70 American and Filipino teachers
