

SEEK REMAINS OF ABORIGINES

LOS ANGELES, Oct. 19.—Excavations of interest and importance to the world are being made at the Hawikuh prehistoric village site, about 50 miles from Gallup, N. M., by members of the Heye Foundation Museum of the American Indian, of New York, according to Capt. Thomas A. Joyce, archaeologist and vice-president of the Royal Anthropological Institute of Great Britain and Ireland, who made Los Angeles his headquarters preparatory to visiting excavation work at Santa Barbara and Santa Catalina Island, Calif. Captain Joyce passed considerable time at the New Mexico excavations.

"The chief present interest of the founder and director of the museum, George Heye," said Captain Joyce, "is the Hendricks-Hodge expedition which has made a number of important discoveries at Hawikuh. Other archaeologists are conducting excavations at Kechip-

aan, a few miles from Hawikuh. "It is one of the richest archaeological fields on the American continent," said Captain Joyce. "The work now going on there, the results of which never before have been published will undoubtedly throw a new light on our information relative to the people who inhabited America prior to its discovery by Columbus."

"Although the work of excavating the prehistoric ruins has just started, we have established without doubt that both Hawikuh and Kechipaan are two of the seven settlements known as 'The Seven Cities of Cibola,' seen by Vasquez de Coronado."

"Presence of iron on some of the top layers of the excavation signifies that the villages were ancient before the Spanish conquest. Other conclusive proof found is the gradual development of pottery uncovered. In the lower levels, the pottery is plain and it graduates into some very excellent examples as higher levels are reached."

"The excavations reveal that a succession of tribes inhabited this region in prehistoric days. They also show the gradual development of the human beings who lived there from the age of the crude stone implements up to the more advanced

periods. Evidence also has been found tending to show that sometimes a considerable period elapsed between the passing of one tribe and the coming of the next."

"Articles unearthed bear a striking resemblance to the primitive utensils and other objects still in use by the Zuni Indians on whose reservation Hawikuh and Kechipaan are situated."

"On the top layers we uncovered evidence of the natives, association with white men. These whites evidently erected a church and a monastery."

Captain Joyce was accompanied on a visit to the workings near Gallup by Heye and L. G. C. Clarke, curator of the Museum of Ethnology of Cambridge, Eng. The party is making a tour of the southwest inspecting museums and places where excavations are in progress.

The excavations, being carried on at Santa Barbara, Santa Catalina Island, and other parts of California, are yielding a vast amount of data relative to the American aborigines, according to Heye, who says California is proving a rich field for the archaeologist.

CORRECT SIGNS AIM OF A. A. A.

WASHINGTON, Oct. 18.—An official "milestone" for every city and town in the United States is

suggested by the American Automobile Association, to avoid the confusion arising from the present habit of taking measurements from any one of several points in a city, which themselves may be a mile or even several miles apart.

Every motorist will recall, at some time in his travels, having seen a sign reading "eight miles to Jonesville," and then, a couple of

minutes on passing another sign, finding again that Jonesville is still eight miles away. Both signs may be correct, depending on the point in Jonesville from which the mileage was taken.

From a commercial standpoint an official milestone would be of service in giving readers of advertisements of real estate, for example, definite information. A farm may be advertised as being

six miles distant from Jonesville. With the adoption of an official milestone by Jonesville, the reader would know that the distance is six miles from a fixed point in Jonesville, which would be in the heart of the city.

"The cost of putting up the official milestone can be negligible. A simple marker could serve the purpose. Automobile clubs in many instances will be willing to erect the marker or milestone for the city or town."
