Lake Murat Legend Predicts Bloodshed

GENEVA, Oct. 30.—The "blood of the Burgundians" has appeared again on the water of Lake Murat, near Neuchâtel, portending more trouble for old Europe, if ancient legends are to be believed. The reddening of the water of this lake is caused by the flowering of

an aquatic plant, which, however, blooms very rarely. The phenomenon was seen in 1476, when 36,000 Burgundians under Charles the Bold, were defeated near the lake by the Swiss. The last time the waters were red was in 1914, just before the outbreak of the world war, a circumstance said to justify the old saying, "When the blood is seen on Lake Murat there will be bloodshed in Europe."

DINERS IN SOFIA KISS HANDS THAT BRING THEM FOOD

SOBIA, Oct. 30.—There are not many restaurants in the world where a diner kisses the waitress's hand before he proceeds to order his dinner. But there is such a public restaurant in this city, and it is probably the only one of its kind in the world.

This restaurant, called the "Ruski Restaurant," is kept, waited on and cooked for by Russian women of the nobility, some of whom used to have "salons" in Petrograd under the empire, to which princes, generals, diplomats and even the regarded it an honor to be admitted.

Driven to the ends of the earth by Bolshevik persecution, these particular "princesses, countesses, serene English altesses"—as Sverdrup called them in "Trilby"—settled down to the business of their wrecked lives in this little corner almost beneath the shadow of the beautiful equestrian statue of the "Czar Liberator," Alexander II.

It is somewhat disconcerting to American eyes to see a tall Russian who seems to have seen better days rise from his table when the waitress comes to take the order, salute madame's hand with his lips in the best manner of a courtier, then resume his seat and address himself to the prosaic business of ordering his meal.

And the food—served in the open air under the trees in the summer—suggests enough of an approach to American ideas of what is good to eat that Americans and Englishmen, to say nothing of other "Europeans," are among the best patrons of the "Ruski Restaurant."

The prices are enough above the average to make the place rather exclusive, and the waitresses are pronounced, by Americans at least, to be entirely satisfactory.

TRACTORS FAIL TO REPLACE DOGS IN ARCTIC SNOWS

COPENHAGEN, Oct. 30.—Dog teams still hold the leading position as a means of conveyance in the frozen north; a certain type of power tractor has been tried in their stead but found wanting, in the opinion of Lange Koch, the Danish explorer, who has just returned to Copenhagen after experimenting in northern Greenland with the machines. It is almost impossible to substitute self-propelled machinery for dogs, he says.

The party left Copenhagen in a small motor schooner in July, 1920, and by the following March had built a base 125 miles north of Thule, in latitude 75 north. The first difficulty with the tractors was experienced in unloading them from the boat and getting them on inland ice. In 12 inches of snow up a slight incline but at very slow speed the tractors dragged a load consisting of nine barrels of petrol, a barrel of oil, a barrel of benzine, tent materials, etc. It is therefore necessary for the tractor to drag great weight which consist mainly of its own fuel and oil. While the motor worked very well at thirty degrees, below zero, considerable difficulty was experienced at lower temperatures, and finally it was necessary to abandon the use of the tractors entirely, as they held up the progress of the expedition and showed signs of wearing out quickly.

The Koch expedition was organized as a scientific and mapping expedition and in this capacity was eminently successful.
