P. S. Dyer, proprietor of the Peerless Lunch, has left on an extended trip throughout the middle west. He will visit for some time in Nebraska.

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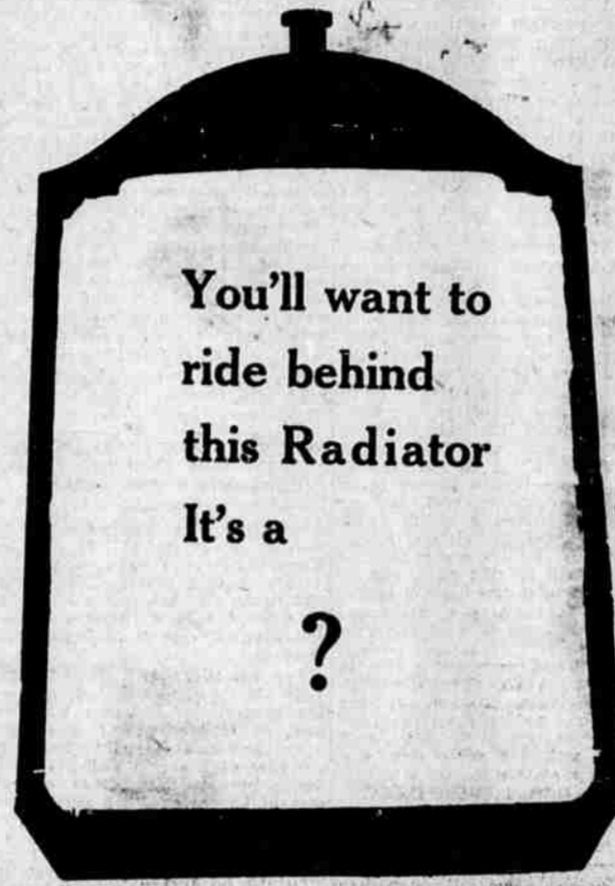
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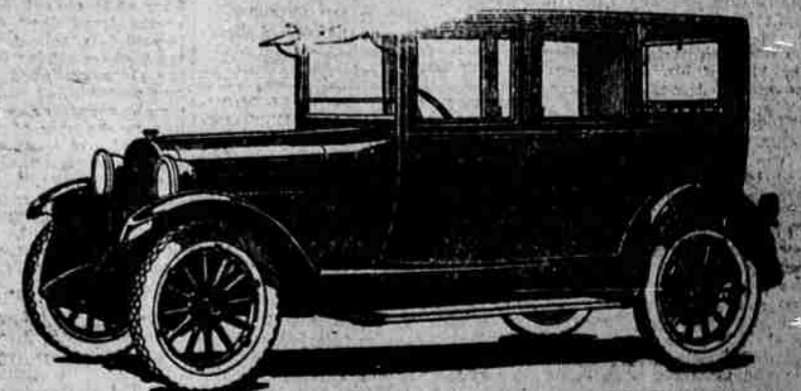
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
