"Now good digestion waits on appetite, and good health on both." Thanksgiving may be a time of real joy on account of a number of conditions, but first and best of all is good health. Of course, we must remember there is no such condition as bad health; all health is good. But if your digestive system is doing the right thing and there is sufficient coal in the bin to counteract the attacks of the weather man, why worry about the size of the turkey? To eat your Thanksgiving dinner in an enjoyable way and at the same time avoid impairing your health is our topic for the day.

Remember that cheerfulness is a most necessary asset for enjoying a real meal. If your wife has invited someone who doesn't agree with someone who doesn't agree with your idea on the league of nations, don't forget to carry on with a smile just the same. It helps the liver secretions. If you are an inside worker, try and hike a few miles before dinner. It's a wonderful tonic for the appetite. Drop in on someone who may be less fortunate than yourself and drop a good-sized package of Thanksgiving cheer in the shape of a dinner basket. Your own dinner will taste much better and it won't impair your health one bit.

Many people will find a real help to digestion if regular eating habits are observed. The change of food for the day is the real joy. Don't think you have to eat everything. Enjoy the occasion by the absence of any hurry or worry. They increase blood pressure and bring on that throbbing headache.

Don't Hurry. Run your dinner on schedule time and don't keep the man part of the family waiting two or three hours. He will hurry his eating and approach the feast in a wrong attitude of mind.

Don't forget to enjoy the vegetables; use plenty of green ones. They help the turkey or roast pig on its way rejoicing. Your health will not suffer if celery, spinach, cabbage or some tempting dish of tomatoes form a part of your menu. The best kind of season is reason. The fruits are preferred for des-

CASE IS DISMISSED

After drawing a jury and serving a number of witnesses, in preparation for the trial of Frank Arruda, accused of maintaining a nuisance by having liquor deposited therein, District Attorney Bowes appeared yesterday afternoon and dismissed the case.

Nick Redmond, who was arrested Monday afternoon following an exciting chase by a motorcycle patrolman, was brought before the justice court yesterday, pleaded guilty and was fined \$250 and given 60 days in jail. Redmond was arrested on two separate counts, transportation

and possession of intoxicating liquors. He pleaded guilty to both but was sentenced only on the transportation charge. After his present sentence is served he still has a sentence for the second charge hanging over him.

His wife appeared in justice court yesterday afternoon making inquiry for the automobile that was confiscated.

To be arrested 50 or 60 miles from town is often an expensive procedure for the one arrested, as Charles Lenz, Jr., of Big Marsh, will testify. The costs of the case of Charles Lenz were just five times the amount of fine imposed. Lenz was arrested following an investigation of the state health officer and charged with maintaining a slaughter house in an unsanitary condition. He was then brought to Klamath Falls, fined \$10 and paid costs of \$50.50—\$47 transportation charges to bring him here, and \$3.50 costs in the justice court.

Axel Ekwall who is charged with operating an automobile while intoxicated, pleaded not guilty and a jury trial will be held in justice court.

Forgery Suspect Denies He Had Eighteen Wives

PORTLAND, Nov. 28.—Walter J. Harmon, alias H. J. Steen, who arrived yesterday from Juneau where he was arrested on a forgery charge, denied he had 18 wives. Detective Swennes said the correspondents misunderstood him when he said Harmon was wanted on 18 charges of bigamy and forgery.
