SAVED WATERSHED, MAY GET INDUSTRY

EUGENE, Ore., Dec. 1.—The action of the city council of Cottage Grove, Ore., near Eugene, in adopting a resolution permitting the cutting of two million feet of timber in the Layton creek watershed which is the source of the city's water supply may result in the establishment of a lumber industry that will cut 10,000,000 feet a year for 40 years or more, according to officials of that city.

The city's pipe line will be carried to Dinner creek and also connected with Prayther creek, measurements having been made to show that they will furnish ample water and that they will not be within the proposed area of the logging operations.

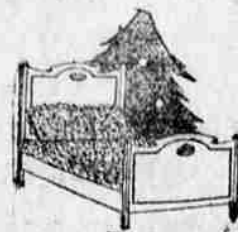

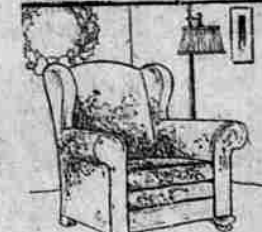
