

# CHRISTMAS BOX FOR CHILDREN

### Members of W.C.T.U. Will Complete Packing of Gifts Tomorrow

Members of the W. C. T. U. will meet at the home of Mrs. George Hallett, North Ninth street, at 2:30 Friday afternoon, December 14, to complete the packing of a Christmas box for children at the farm home near Corvallis. The boxes will be shipped immediately.

"Through efforts of the W. C. T. U. of Oregon this farm of 245 acres, 3 1/2 miles northeast of Corvallis, was purchased at a cost of \$200 an acre," said Mrs. Fred W. Abbey, chairman of the committee. "Two cottages, modern in every detail, have been erected and are now occupied by 47 of the most needy of homeless children. Another cottage is nearing completion, and more will be built as fast as funds are available, for the need is great that these waifs of the street be gathered into homes, loved and educated as near to our American standard as possible.

"Each cottage is adequate for 20 children and caretakers, who are women that rejoice in mothering these little unfortunates, and men who are proud to be called daddy by them.

"It is part of the plan that this home shall be self-supporting. Already three fine cows have been given and some chickens. Think what country air, fresh milk and eggs, good plain food in general will do for children who have been deprived of such comforts. Besides, they will be taught to work. The bus takes them to and from school in Corvallis. No doubt some of these little ones will become important citizens of the future.

"We are proud to have a part in this splendid work, proud of our merchants who so generously contributed clothing, toys, candy, nuts, etc. Thirteen pairs of overalls and 16 suits of D. V. D.'s were given by one firm.

"Other firms gave generously—one as high as \$27.55 worth. The estimated value of the box is about \$125.

# In the Courts

## Kenneth Hutchins Co. vs. Klamath Livestock Mortgage Co.

Defendant having been found in default for want of appearance and the complaint having been read by the court and suitable cause of action found, judgment was found against defendant in the case of Kenneth Hutchins versus Klamath Livestock Mortgage company for the sum of \$818.34, interest at 8 per cent on the amount from September 29, 1921, and plaintiff's attorney's fees of \$100.

## Robert Lewellen versus Sue M. Lewellen.

Robert Lewellen who brought suit for divorce against Sue M. Lewellen was awarded a divorce decree by the circuit court, but the court further adjudged and decreed that the minor child be given to defendant, that the plaintiff pay to defendant \$25 for the child's support, and that any property belonging to plaintiff and defendant be given to the defendant for the child.

## S. F. Cattle Loan Co. versus Klamath Livestock Co.

Sale of property at sheriff's sale following judgment in the case of San Francisco Cattle Loan company versus Klamath Livestock company was confirmed by the court in a decree recently handed down by the circuit court.

## David C. Skeen versus Molly Skeen.

A recent decree handed down by Circuit Judge Leavitt granted David C. Skeen an absolute divorce from Molly Skeen, defendant, who was found in default for non-appearance.

## Roy C. Hicks versus J. R. Fogg.

In the case of Roy C. Hicks versus J. R. Fogg, judgment was found against the defendant for the sum of \$50 and in addition it was decreed that defendant pay plaintiff's attorney's fees of \$40 and all costs and disbursements.

## Credit Service Co. versus Betty Store.
