HEAVYWEIGHTS MEET TONIGHT

Earl Ritchie to Have His Second Chance at Frank Farmer

Earl Ritchie, local heavyweight champion, at Scandinavian hall tonight will once more try his luck with Frank Farmer, the Cle Elum logger, whose trusty right in the first fight put the local boy out in the seventh.

As a favorite, Farmer seems to have a slight edge, largely because of his former victory, but many consider that if the fight goes the full ten rounds Ritchie has better than an even chance. That, however, is purely conjecture, and has no bearing on what may happen.

U. S. FLEET TO HAVE MIMIC WAR

Extensive Maneuvers Will be Held to Test Defense of Panama Canal

LOS ANGELES, Cal., Dec. 20.—Maneuvers of such magnitude as to constitute a mimic war, rather than a sham battle, will test existing conceptions of defense affecting the Panama canal when the United States fleet begins its operations for 1934 at midnight on January 3, according to naval officers here.

Prominent among the new phases of combat expected to enter into this "war" for possession of the canal will be the influence of dirigible aircraft on surface maneuvers at sea. The Shenandoah, the navy's new giant dirigible, will remain aloft throughout the maneuvers, supported by squadrons of combat craft by day, and ascending above the clouds at night.

Eighteen first-line battleships, 72 destroyers, 20 planes of all types, 50 submarines and hundreds of fleet auxiliary craft will combine to make the canal defense maneuvers the most extensive yet undertaken by the American navy.

One feature of the "hostilities" will be the use of marines, who will launch an artillery and infantry attack against the United States army forces defending the canal.

The battle fleet, under Rear Admiral Samuel S. Robison, will open the operations with a surprise attack against the Pacific side of the canal, which will be defended by a scouting fleet under Vice-Admiral Newton McCully.

There will be an air problem for both sides, the Pacific force using catapulted planes for local scouting, and the Atlantic force sending out plane fleets from its aircraft carriers, the Langley and the Wright. Submarines also will be used in the defense of the canal.

The first use of aircraft fog and smoke screens in such operations will take place at Panama when, in a combined air attack on the canal, the army will interpose an aerial screen.

The land and sea attack will simulate in many ways the allied assaults on Gallipoli during the war.

OLD LONDON ALSO HAS STREET TROUBLE

British Officials Mashed Worked Up Over Frequent Tearing Up of Thoroughfares

LONDON, Dec. 20.—British officials are worked up over the frequent tearing up of the streets of London and an effort is to be made to put a stop or at least regulate the practice. Frank Pick, assistant managing director of underground railways, recently declared that 65 different bodies have the statutory right to dig up London streets whenever they feel so disposed.

Borough surveyors complain that the post office is the worst offender and frequently chooses newly paved streets for telephone cables. A London traffic bill has been framed and will be presented to the new Parliament as soon as it convenes.
