MAN O'WAR TAKES PLACE AS GREATEST MONEY MAKER OF ALL

NEW YORK, Jan. 17.—The 1924 racing season holds unusual interest for lovers of thoroughbreds because it will bring out, as two-year-olds, the first of the get of the famous Man o' War, which as a three-year-old was never defeated, and except for Zev, proved the greatest money winner thoroughbred in American turf history.

Twelve colts and fillies of Man o' War are qualified for two-year-old racing this year. All but one of the number are owned by Samuel D. Riddle whose colors Man o' War carried, and W. M. Jeffords. J. K. Maddox, who was Riddle's adviser when the latter purchased Man o' War for \$5000 as a yearling, owns the remaining colt.

Nine of the 12 already have been given names that suggest their fa-

REALTY CONCLAVE STARTS IN SOUTH

AUGUSTA, Ga., Jan. 18.—The mid-winter session of the National Association of Real Estate Boards, convening in Augusta, Ga., January 17, 18 and 19, has on its program the study of an undertaking by the organized realtors of the United States, which they say is so related to the fundamental matters of public policy and the business conditions as to be characterized as industrial statesmanship. Delegates from 17 real estate boards from all sections of the country are expected to attend.

The principal work of the conference, according to the program, will be centered in the formulation of public policies on questions affecting real estate interests and the ownership of real property. The conference, as outlined in its program, will go into every phase of real estate dealing as it is related to the growth of cities, the development of property values, the spread of home ownership and the safety of investment.
