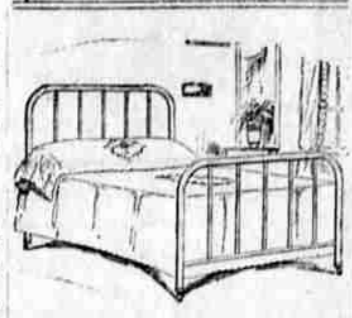

Sealed bids in duplicate on forms provided therefor, marked outside "Bid, North Marsh Unit" and addressed to the Superintendent, Klamath Agency, Oregon, will be received until 2 o'clock p. m., Pacific time, Thursday, June 5, 1924, for the purchase of the merchantable timber on a tract within the Klamath Indian Reservation, Oregon, lying principally in Township 29 South, Range 8, 9 and 10 East, and including approximately 30,000 acres of unallotted pine lands within an area of 56,000 acres and with an estimated stand of 300,000,000 feet of western yellow pine.

Within the limits of the unit there is an additional area of approximately 1,540 acres of allotted land with an estimated stand of 5,000,000 feet, mostly yellow pine, for which separate approved contracts must afterward be made with allottees desiring to contract, and on terms similar to the contract for the unallotted timber. Each bid must state the price per thousand feet, B. M., Scribner Decimal C Log Scale, that will be paid for timber cut and scaled prior to April 1, 1928.
