

BOURBONS PLAN THEIR PROGRAM

Convention Schedule Will Be Similiar to Other Years

NEW YORK, June 23.—The tentative program of the Democratic National Convention follows closely the schedule of procedure which has prevailed in previous national sessions of the party.

The first formal assembly of 2600 delegates and alternates at the main auditorium, Madison Square Garden will be at noon of Tuesday, June 24.

Cordell Hull of Tennessee, chairman of the Democratic National Committee, will call the convention to order, and a member of the New York City clergy will pronounce an invocation.

Hyman to Speak Mayor John F. Hyman of New York will deliver an address formally welcoming the convention to this city, and adjournment will be taken, probably at about 3:30 p. m. until noon Wednesday.

Platform is Stated The platform probably will be presented to the convention on Friday.

The nomination of candidates for the presidency, of whom a score already are in sight, will begin late Friday or early Saturday accompanied by the traditional bandplaying, singing and noisy demonstrations as each candidate's name is put forward.

Thus the convention will adhere to a prescribed formula for only the first five days. If nominations are not made, immediately, there will be continuous day and night sessions, except on Sundays and continuous balloting until a nominee for president and a running-mate for the vice-presidency shall emerge from the fray victorious.

The 1920 convention at San Francisco lasted nine days. Some local party councilors predict the impending convolve, confronted by so many candidates to choose from, will be kept busy for 11 days.

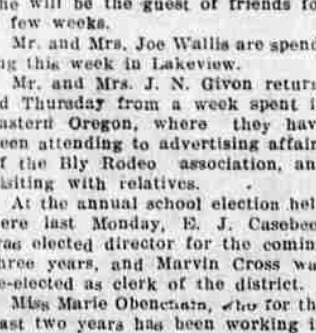
EAST IS ENJOYING CUTS IN GAS RATE
