Besides the principals the attorney general named as parties a number of "secondary defendants" whom he charged were in combination as a result of accepting licenses from one or more of the primary defen-dants. Nearly all important companies, including all of Standard Oil companies, were cited. The at-torney general charged them with having combined to control production of gasoline by the pooling of asserted patent rights in violation of the anti-trust act.
