Saturday, November 15th, 1924. Court met pursuant to adjournment, all members being present, when the following proceedings were had:

IN THE COUNTY COURT OF THE STATE OF OREGON FOR KLAMATH COUNTY

Order Declaring Result of Election

In the matter of submitting to the voters of Klamath County at the General Election on November 4, 1924, the question of issuing bonds for the construction and maintenance of permanent roads in Klamath County, Oregon.

WHEREAS, heretofore, to-wit: on the 20th day of September, 1924, this County Court made and caused to be entered an order for the submission to the voters of Klamath County at the General election to be held on the 4th day of November, 1924, for the purpose of raising bonds for the purpose of raising money to be used for the construction and maintenance of permanent roads in said County; and

WHEREAS, in said order of this Court so made and entered on said 20th day of September, 1924, and in said order of this Court so made and entered on said 4th day of October, 1924, it was provided that the amount of the proposed bonded indebtedness should be \$125,000.00; and that the maximum rate of interest said bonds should bear should not exceed 5 per cent per annum; and said orders stated that particular roads within said Klamath County were and are to be constructed and improved by the money so expended, and the minimum to be raised on each of said roads, and also stated the exact location of said roads, and each thereof, within said County, giving the beginning and the terminus thereof; and

WHEREAS, the said order of said 20th day of September, 1924, was made and entered in the Journal of this Court more than 40 days next preceding said General Election so to be held, and said order did set out the amount of the bonds proposed to be issued, the length of time they shall run, and the maximum rate of interest they shall bear; and

WHEREAS, in making and entering the said order of said 4th day of October, 1924, submitting said question to the voters of said County at said General Election, the County Court did cause printed notices thereof, signed by the County Clerk, to be posted in like manner as notices of General Elections are posted; which said notices did particularly specify the amount of bonds proposed to be issued, the length of time they shall run, and the maximum rate of interest they shall bear, and the road or roads to be constructed or improved, and the amount to be expended on each; and which said notices were prepared 30 days before said General Election, and mailed to the Judges and Clerks of Elections in each precinct, as required by law, together with instructions relative to the legal posting thereof; A copy of which said instructions is hereto attached and marked Exhibit "A"; and

WHEREAS, the records of this Court show that said notices were posted in like manner as notices of General Elections are posted, and that each and all of said notices were posted at least 30 days before the date of the election, and were substantially in the form required by Section 4639 of Oregon Laws, as will more fully and in length appear by a copy of said notice hereto attached, and marked Exhibit "B"; and

WHEREAS, the County Court did have printed to be used at such elections the same number of ballots, both official ballots and sample ballots, as were and are required by the election laws covering the General Election, which said ballots were in substantially the form provided by Section 4631 of Oregon Laws; one of said ballots is hereto attached, and marked Exhibit "C"; and

WHEREAS, on said 4th day of November, 1924, said question of issuing such bonds was submitted to the voters of Klamath County at the General Election held on said date, and the Judges and Clerks appointed for such General Election did act as Judges and Clerks at the Road Bond Election, and at the time and in the manner provided by law the votes cast at said Road Bond Election, so held on said 4th day of November, 1924, have been canvassed in the same manner as the votes cast at said General Election; and

WHEREAS, the County Court has heretofore found from the election returns and the canvass thereof, that a majority of the voters voting

at the said Road Bond Election did vote in favor of issuing such bonds; and

WHEREAS, every requirement of law relating to the said election has been duly complied with, in the form, at the time, and in the manner required by law;

NOW THEREFORE, it is

ORDERED AND DECLARED, that at the Road Bond Election held in Klamath County, Oregon, on the 4th day of November, 1924, under and pursuant to Title XXX, Chapter XIII, of Oregon Laws, to determine whether there shall be issued bonds of Klamath County, to the amount of \$125,000, due as follows:

\$3,000 eleven years from date of issue; \$2,000 twelve years from date of issue; \$2,000 thirteen years from date of issue; \$2,000 fourteen years from date of issue; \$3,000 fifteen years from date of issue; \$5,000 sixteen years from date of issue; \$5,000 seventeen years from date of issue; \$5,000 eighteen years from date of issue; \$5,000 nineteen years from date of issue; \$5,000 twenty years from date of issue; \$7,000 twenty one years from date of issue; \$7,000 twenty two years from date of issue; \$7,000 twenty three years from date of issue; \$7,000 twenty four years from date of issue; \$7,000 twenty five years from date of issue; \$7,000 twenty six years from date of issue; \$10,000 twenty seven years from date of issue; \$10,000 twenty eight years from date of issue; \$10,000 twenty nine years from date of issue; \$10,000 thirty years from date of issue;

with interest not to exceed 5 per cent per annum, to provide for permanent road construction, a majority of the voters voting at such election did vote in favor of issuing bonds, the vote thereon being as follows:

Yes—3611 votes, No—1384 votes, Majority in favor of issuing bonds 2227 votes;

And it is further ordered, that this order declaring the fact that a majority of the voters voting at the said election did vote in favor of issuing such bonds, shall be entered in the Journal of the County Court, and shall be absolutely conclusive as to the regularity of all the proceedings in reference to this matter; and it is further hereby

ORDERED AND DESIGNATED, that the amount of the total assessed valuation of all the property within the County is \$24,660,161.19; and the amount of the previous debts and liabilities of said Klamath County incurred for road purposes, and remaining unpaid is \$289,794.00.

Saturday, November 22nd 1924. Court met pursuant to adjournment, all members being present, when the following proceedings were had:

This Agreement, made and entered into at Klamath Falls, Oregon, the 22nd day of November, A. D. 1924, by and between the County of Klamath, by and through its duly authorized County Court, party of the first part, and A. E. Doty and S. K. Messenger, parties of the second part.

Witnesseth: For and in consideration of the covenants of the respective parties hereto, it is hereby mutually agreed, that second parties will clear and grub approximately ten miles of the right of way of the Dulles-California Highway (beginning at Station 418, (the same being the northerly end of the present clearing,) and extending in a northerly direction to Station 125-11' 5".

It is mutually agreed, that said clearing shall be 60 ft. in width, viz 30 ft. on either side of the center line of the highway right of way, and the grubbing shall be 40 ft. in width, viz: 20 ft. on either side of the center line of said highway right of way, said right of way so covered by this agreement shall be a continuous piece of clearing and grubbing, extending for a distance of approximately ten miles.

It is further mutually agreed, that the second parties hereto shall and will furnish all tools, implements, materials and labor in the performance of said strip clearing and grubbing of said strip of land above described; that they will perform said work for the price specified, to-wit: Six hundred fifty (\$650) dollars per mile of lineal measurement that they will complete said work of clearing and grubbing on or before the first day of May, 1925; and said second parties will do said clearing and grubbing, and perform the work thereof in a skillful and workmanlike manner, and in accordance with the CONSTRUCTION DETAILS FOR CLEARING AND GRUBBING, as such details are contained in the Standard Specifications, Proposal, Contract and Bond for Forest Road Construction, a copy of which is now on file with the county clerk of Klamath County, Oregon, and which said Standard Details are hereby referred to, and by such reference are made a part hereof.

It is further mutually agreed by the parties hereto, that in lieu of second parties furnishing a bond for the faithful performance of this contract, the first party shall withhold from the payments to be made from time to time, 60 per cent of the amount of such respective payments, which said 60 per cent so withheld shall be paid to second parties upon the completion and acceptance by the County of the work of said clearing and grubbing; the other 40 per cent shall be paid by first party to second party from time to time, for work performed, and such payments shall be made in the usual manner of making payments for highway construction, or upon the approval of said work, or upon the receipt in record by the duly authorized engineer of first party hereto.
