

# GAS REPLACING OIL IS CLAIM

### Revolutions and Development of Industry Are Predicted

SAN FRANCISCO, Feb. 12.—Revolution in the methods of manufacturing gas in America is almost a certainty of the immediate future, was the prediction made here today by Harry C. Abell, of New York, president of the American Gas Association. In his opening remarks before the midwinter meeting of gas company executives. This will come about, the speaker declared, because the industry will be called upon to replace the nation's falling supply of oil with gaseous fuel for industrial heating.

Mr. Abell bases his prediction on President Coolidge's recent action in the creation of the Federal Oil Conservation Board. He interprets this to mean rapid, and probably drastic, curtailment of the use of oil in industrial heating processes where it now furnishes perhaps 80 percent of the fuel supply where gas could be used.

"The estimated available and usable supply of oil in the United States is 9,000,000,000 barrels and the present rate of annual production 250,000,000 barrels," Mr. Abell said. "It is apparent, therefore, that the supply will last only 12 years. A strict conservation program, national in scope, seems to be the only solution, and such a program means that the industrial plants of the nation will be obliged to turn to manufactured gas for their fuel requirements."

"The roads that in ten years the gas output will increase at least 100 percent and probably a great deal more, and 20,000,000 customers will be expected to be made of gas companies."

Penn's old college, by way of amends, has his portrait hung conspicuously in its hall. As the Pilgrim divines were chiefly Cambridge men, Oxford, most of all its American connections, Lord Baltimore is still without a memorial in his old college, Trinity, but as Trinity has portraits of two of its students well known in American history, William Pitt who won the continent, and Lord North who lost half of it, the college feels satisfied.
