DISOWN WIVES OF AMERICANS

More Than 5000 Women Deprived of British Citizenship

LONDON, Feb. 14.—There is a steadily growing group of women living in England who are women without a country. They are former English women whom their government disowns on their marriage to a citizen of the United States...

At the time the bill was enacted the number of English women married to Americans in England was very small and little notice was taken of the hardships forced upon them. Now these nationally out-

cast women in England number about 5,000 and their predicament is constantly being brought to the notice of the British government...

Neither the government nor the consuls will grant passports to these women although requests are made daily for this privilege. The British government, according to their law, believes that the woman becomes an American citizen on marriage and therefore refuses passport facilities.

Several attempts to have the matter satisfactorily settled have been made by Anglo-American organizations in England but just now there is no disposition on the part of either government to change the existing laws.

Most of the women affected have no opportunity of residing in the United States for the year required to obtain American citizenship and it is for this class that an appeal
