OUT OF THE AIR

(Continued from yesterday) In the Baltic States, a radio committee in Estonia has adopted preliminary regulations...

France has two broadcasting stations, one a two KW at the Eiffel tower, operated by the war ministry...

Germany owns thirteen broadcasting stations, most of them owned by the Administration and operated by private interests...

Great Britain has seventeen stations operated entirely by the British Broadcasting company. One is in Ireland where the government will probably conduct operations...

Holland has seven stations. Question whether government will give concessions for two or three stations or whether broadcasting interests will install only one station for regular broadcasting for the entire country...

Hungary operates its only 250 watt station for occasional programs. The Post Office will install a 500 watt station at once.

In Italy, a Union of Broadcasting

interests is to install stations in Rome, Milan, and Naples. There will be a tax of 75 Lire, about \$14.25 on each receiver sold, two thirds of which will go to the broadcasting company...
