## BIG LOAN WILL GO TO FRANCE

PARIS, Feb. 19.—Promise of a \$100,000,000 loan for the improvement of French finances and another \$35,000,000 for the devastated regions, to be floated in the United States as soon as the budget is definitely balanced and voted, was one of the remedies for France's troubled financial and economic situation advanced by finance Minister Clementel in an address before the chamber deputies today.

M. Clementel gave no details and refrained from saying whether assurance of the loans came through the Morgan group which handled all the French financing operations in the United States.

He limited himself to the simple declaration: "M. Loucheur (former French Minister of Commerce) has advocated a foreign loan. We have the promise that when our budget

is definitely and finally voted and balanced, one loan of \$100,000,000 for the French treasury and another of \$35,000,000 for the devastated regions will be issued in the United States."

## BAZ WILLIAMS WILL REPLACE SPELLMAN

EUGENE, Ore., Feb. 19.—Basil (Baz) Williams of Eugene, coach of Freshman football at the University of Oregon for the past five years, was elected to succeed Bart Spellman, varsity line coach, resigned, at a meeting of the athletic committee last night.

The appointment of Williams as varsity line coach leaves a vacancy in the position of freshman mentor. Among the men mentioned as possible candidates for that position are Mike Sax, former Oregon star and coach of the Sensational Lincoln high school team in Portland last year; Spike Leal's, former Oregon line-man and present coach of the Eugene high school team, and Prince (Pink) Callison, former Oregon center, coach at Medford high school.

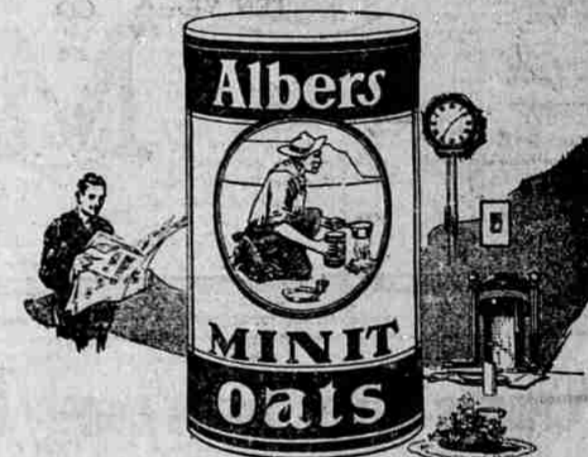
