COUNTY COURT PROCEEDINGS

Saturday, December 13th, 1924. Court met pursuant to adjournment, all members being present, when the following proceedings were had:

IN THE COUNTY COURT OF THE STATE OF OREGON, FOR KLAMATH COUNTY

In the matter of the Laying out Changing and Vacating the County Road between the Altamont Ranch Tracts.

The above matter coming on to be heard this 13th day of December 1924, and it appearing to the court that the Board of County Road Viewers did on the 5th day of November, being the first day of the November term of this court file herein its report in writing, stating its recommendations in favor of the establishment and changing of said road as is hereinafter mentioned, and setting forth the reasons for the same, and it appearing to said court that the County Surveyor has made a plat of the preliminary line, showing the alignment of said proposed road and the general topography adjacent, and showing the ties to government corners along said road, and it appearing to the court that said plat and said report further states that none of said premises will be less valuable by reason of the proposed location of said road, and said plat and said report having been filed in the office of the County Clerk on the date fixed by the county court, and at the next regular term of said county court following the expiration of 10 days after the filing of the report of said Board of County Road Viewers, and being at the December term of the said court, the said court having caused said report to be publicly read on two different days of said term, to-wit: on the 3rd day of December, 1924, and on the 6th day of December, 1924, and no person whose lands are directly affected by said report having filed herein any petition for damages, and no freeholder residing in the road district where such road is located, whose name does not appear upon the petition, having filed a remonstrance against the proposed establishment, and no one appearing to object to the granting of said petition and this being the day following the second reading of said report, and the court proceeding to consider said report and no petition for damages or remonstrance,

with a greater number of remonstrators than there is of petitioners upon the petition having been filed, and the court being satisfied that such road will be of public utility, and that the said road will cause no damage to any person, firm or corporation, and the court finding that the report of said viewers is favorable thereto.

It is hereby ordered, adjudged and decreed that said report be and the same hereby is adopted by this court.

And it is further ordered, adjudged and decreed that said road be finally surveyed and opened and the field notes be recorded in suitable books kept for that purpose in the office of the county surveyor and that from this date, such road be

REVENUE BILLS GIVEN APPROVAL

Added to the above is the state's available cash of \$5,684,981.90, which brings the grand total up to \$7,619,981.90.

Money Left Over
Previously published appropriations and allowances totaled \$6,837,895.52. Since then other appropriations have been added in the sum of \$133,399.41, making total appropriations and allowances to date \$6,971,294.93. This subtracted from \$7,619,981.90 leaves \$648,686.97.

Some members of the ways and means committee still favor a direct tax levy of one mill by the legislature so that normal tax base under the six per cent tax limitation may not be lacking next year and in the years to come. Governor Pierce appeared before the committee last night and emphatically objected to this, declaring that if the levy were made he probably would veto the bill. Those who believe in this means of raising another million—and possibly withdrawing some of the revenue bills already approved by the committee—will talk the question over with the governor today.

Beginning at a point 75.4 feet north of the northeast corner of Tract 21, Altamont Ranch Tracts, thence north 40 feet, thence south 89 deg. 56 minutes west 2976.9 feet, thence south 40 feet, thence north 89 deg. 56 minutes east 2976.9 feet to the place of beginning, and that former road which is changed, altered and vacated to make way for said road hereby established and which is hereby declared to be no longer a public highway, is described as follows, to-wit:

Beginning at the northwest corner of Tract 13 of said Altamont Ranch Tracts, thence easterly and along the northerly boundary line of said tract 13, and tracts 17, 18, 19, 20, 21, 22, 23 and 24, of Altamont Ranch Tracts, to the northeast corner of said tract 24, thence northerly 40 feet to the southeast corner of tract 4 of said Altamont Ranch Tracts, thence westerly along the southerly boundary line of tracts 4, 5, and 12 of said Altamont Tracts to the Southwest corner of said Tract 12, thence southerly 40 feet to the place of beginning.

In the matter of transferring \$8,000.00 from Current Expense Fund to Market Road Fund.

It is therefore hereby ordered that the County Treasurer transfer the sum of \$8,000.00 from the Current Expense Fund of the County to the Market Road Fund of the County, and that same be repaid the Current Expense Fund by the Market Road Fund as soon as moneys are received by the Market Road Fund from the collection of taxes.
