### AT THE PINE TREE

When the 1924 season opened Heving was practically unknown, merely the third string catcher of a club that wasn't going anywhere in particular. Before the season closed Heving was alternating back of the bat with the Boston regulars. He had practically supplanted the two veterans Steve O'Neil and Val Picinich. Recently Manager Lee Fohl set at rest the status of Heving for the coming season by announcing that he would be the first string back stop of the Red Sox. "Heving has the makings of a great catcher," says Fohl. "He hasn't quite arrived as yet but I look for him to go big the coming season. He possesses every mechanical asset plus a wise old head."

## James Harrison Wilson, Noted Officer of Civil War, Dies in Delaware

WILMINGTON, Del., Feb. 23.—Major General James Harrison Wilson, U. S. A., retired, last of the corps commanders in the Union army during the Civil war, died at his home here today.

General Wilson was 87 years old. After his retirement from the army, following his service during the war with Spain and the Boxer rebellion in China, he lived in Washington.

He leaves one daughter, Mrs. Henry B. Thompson of this city.
