Power for Export Asked From Canada Waterfalls

OTTAWA, Feb. 26. — Canada leads the world in harnessing water power, according to a report of the Dominion department of the interior Hydro-electric development in Canada was increased to 3,578,000 horsepower in 1924 through the installation of 350,000 additional units, the report said. Principal water power develop-

ments took place in Ontario and Quebec. New hydro development in the prairie provinces and British Columbia totaled nearly 50,000 horsepower.

Water power projects contemplated within the next two years will add 50,000 additional horsepower, the department announced. Work of erecting a plant at Carillon on the Ottawa River to furnish 70,000 horsepower for export to United States industries will be undertaken this year, the department said.

W. C. T. U. STARTS ACTIVE CAMPAIGN THRUOUT NATION

CHICAGO, Feb. 26.—Total abstinence, law observance and pledge signing are features of the Youth's Year program of the National W. C. T. U.
