BEETLES BEATEN BY U. S. DOLLARS

LINCOLN, Eng. Feb. 27.—The appearance of the death-watch beetle inside timbering of one of the towers of Lincoln Cathedral is causing the dean much trouble, but he is equally disappointed with what he calls the stinginess of English people in sending funds to assist in combatting the work of the beetle, and in the restoration of the cathedral.

The generosity of Americans, the dean says, is in great contrast. American money, he points out, has enabled nearly half the work to be done, and by the end of the year he expects to have enough American dollars to pay for the reparation of the central tower and two transepts.

Scores of English tourists visit the cathedral but few of them go to him with a ten pound note, as the Americans do, and say "here is a trifle for your fund," according to the dean.

SWEDISH WOMEN TRAIN FOR WAR

HELSINGFORS, Finland, Feb. 27.—Two hundred thousand Finnish women are organized into Lotta Svaerd clubs, auxiliaries to the voluntary military organizations of men, and are in constant training to support the standing army in case of emergency. The women are organized on a military basis and participate in the manoeuvres of the volunteer forces so that they may be prepared to carry on all work for which women are qualified in time of war. During the drills the women wear coarse, gray garments and sleep on straw, just as the men volunteers do, so as to accustom themselves to the hardships of military service.

The fighting between the red and white forces which followed the establishment of the Russian soviet government saw much of Finland involved in the bitterest sort of civil strife. Railway communications were severed for months and the entire population was involved in a conflict which taught all Finns many lessons in modern warfare.

FLASHING LIGHTS ILLUMINE PATHWAY INTO FRANCE

LONDON, Feb. 27.—In readiness for the night air service to Paris, planned by the Imperial Airways, 41 new flashing beacons have been installed between London and the South Coast of England, to indicate the boundaries of the four airdomes and landing grounds on the route. Fed by acetylene gas stored in cylinders, the lights will operate for six months without attention.

New air expresses, each driven by a big engine in the nose of the machine and two smaller motors in the wings, to minimize the risk of forced landings, will be used in this service.

Hand operated, a machine has been invented that utilizes otherwise scraps of cloth to cover buttons.
